**FILING REQUIREMENTS
FEDERAL COURT ORDER**

For the **2014 Federal Primary Election and General Elections**, all certificates and petitions of designation or nomination, certificates of acceptance or declination of such designations and nominations, certificates of authorization for such designations, certificates of disqualification, certificates of substitution for such designations or nominations and objections and specifications of objections to such certificates and petitions required to be filed with the State Board of Elections or a board of elections outside of the city of New York shall be deemed timely filed and accepted for filing if sent by mail or overnight delivery service (as defined in CPLR §2103(b)(6)) in an envelope postmarked or showing receipt by the overnight delivery service prior to midnight of the last day of filing, and received no later than one business day after the last day to file such certificates, petitions, objections or specifications.

(with at least 100 or 5% of enrolled voters from each of one-half of the congressional districts)

New York City 7,500
any county or borough of New York City 4,000
a municipal court district within NY City 1,500
any city council district within New York City 900
cities or counties having more than 250,000 inhabitants 2,000
cities or counties having more than 25,000 but not more than 250,000 1,000
any city, county, councilmanic or county legislative districts in any city other than NY City 500
any congressional district 1,250
any state senatorial district 1,000
any assembly district 500

any political subdivision contained within another political subdivision, except as herein provided, requirement is not to exceed the number required for the larger subdivision; a political subdivision containing more than one assembly district, county or other political subdivision, requirement is not to exceed the aggregate of the signatures required for the subdivision or parts of subdivision so contained.

NOTE: The information contained here is intended to provide general guidance for those who are preparing to circulate petitions, and is not to be used as a substitute for consulting the Election Law for specific petition requirements.

Persons wishing to run for elective office may be nominated either by a political party or through the filing of an independent nominating petition. Party members may also circulate petitions to create the opportunity to write in the name of an unspecified person for an office in which there is no contest for the party endorsement. The current political parties are the Democratic, Republican, Conservative, Working Families, Independence and Green parties. Any person who is not nominated by one of these parties must file an independent nominating petition. The requirements for all petitions are contained in Article 6 of the Election Law (pdf 3,303KB). The provisions for village elections vary slightly, and the reader is directed to Article 15 of the Election Law (pdf 3,303KB) for specifics.

Running for Office

Party Nominations

Party nomination of candidates for elective office is made at either a party caucus or at a primary election.

Caucuses

A caucus is an open meeting of a town or village's political party at which candidates are nominated for elective office. Only residents of the town or village who are enrolled members of the party may participate in the caucus. For further information on caucuses see, Election Law §6-108 (towns) and §15-108 (villages) (pdf 3,303KB).

Designating Petitions

If a party nominates its candidates through the primary election process, party designations for this primary are made on a designating petition. The Election Law sets forth the form of this petition; §6-132 (state, county and town offices) and §15-108 (village offices). (pdf 3,303KB) Only enrolled members of a party qualified to vote for an office may sign designating petitions of the party.

Nomination of Non-Party Member

Political parties may nominate a candidate who is not an enrolled member of the political party. Such parties must file a certificate of authorization, signed and acknowledged by the presiding officer and the secretary of the meeting at which such authorization is given. A certificate of authorization is not needed for nominations resulting from a caucus or for a candidate for a judicial office.

Independent Nominations

To run for office on a line other than an official party line, one must file an independent nominating petition. The Election Law sets forth the form of this petition; §6-140 (state, county and town offices) and §15-108 (village offices). (pdf 3,303KB) Any registered voter who has not already signed a designating petition, and who is qualified to vote for an office, may sign an independent nominating petition for that office. For Village offices if you participated in a caucus, you cannot sign an independent nominating petition.

Form of Petitions

The statute requires that all petitions be substantially in the form set forth in the law. See, Election Law §6-132 (party designating petitions), §6-140 (independent nominating petitions) and §15-108 (village designating and independent petitions) (pdf 3,303KB). Deviations or slight rearrangements of the form of petition are not fatal defects, provided that the petition contains all of the required information.

Each sheet of the petition must correctly set forth:

- the date of the election;
- the name of the candidate and the office or position sought;
- the candidate's residence, and if different, their mailing or post office address;
- information about the signer: date of signing, voter's residence address, town or city and
- information relating to the person who witnesses the signatures.

A petition may include a committee on vacancies. Failure to provide such a committee, or naming a committee of fewer than three persons, will not invalidate the petition.

The voter need only sign the appropriate line on the petition sheet. All other information may be filled in by someone else. Corrections may be made to any information on the signature line. However, corrections or alterations in the date or the signature MUST be initialed by the person making the correction.

Voters may not sign a petition for more candidates than there are openings for an office. For example, if there is one council seat open, then the voter may only sign one petition for a candidate for that office. If there are 2 seats open, the voter may sign petitions for 2 candidates.

The pages of a petition must be sequentially numbered and securely fastened.

Witnesses to a Petition

Anyone who is qualified to sign a petition may witness a petition. The information required for the witness statement is mandatory. Omissions, errors, or unexplained alterations/corrections, may invalidate the entire page. When the witness signs the statement of witness, they are making an oath that subjects them to the penalties for perjury if any of the information preceding their signature is false. The information preceding the signature includes the name and residence of the witness; the number of signatures on the page; a statement that each person signed in their presence; and the date they are signing the statement. Witness identification information, which follows the witness's signature, may be provided by anyone, at any time before the petition is filed. This information includes the town or city; and the county of the witness's registration.

Cover Sheets

If there are 10 or more pages in a petition, there must be a cover sheet. In New York City, and in other counties where identification numbers are used, only one cover sheet is required, regardless of the number of volumes in the petition. In all other instances, a multi-volume petition requires a cover sheet for each volume.

Cover sheets must contain the following information:

- Name, residence address, and mailing address if different, of the candidate.
- The public office or party position sought.
- The name of the party or independent body making the nomination.
- A statement that the petition contains a number of signatures equal to or in excess of the number required by statute.
- The volume number OR identification number of that volume.
- The total number of volumes in each petition OR the identification number for each volume of the petition.

The following information is optional:

The name, residence address, (and mailing address if different) telephone number, and facsimile number of the person designated to receive notice of deficiencies in binding or cover sheet requirements.

There are additional requirements if the petition contains candidates for county committee, and if there are different candidates on the several pages of the petition. Those requirements are contained in Part 6215 of the rules and regulations of the State Board of Elections.

Pursuant to Part 6215 of the rules and regulations of the State Board of Elections, the Board will provide notice of any correctable errors in cover sheet(s) and binding.

Filing of Petitions, Acceptances, Authorizations and Declinations

All filings must be filed timely (See the Political Calendar) and in the proper manner at the appropriate board of elections. Pursuant to section 1-106(1) of the New York State Election Law, all papers are required to be filed between the hours of nine A.M. and five P.M. If the last day for filing shall fall on a Saturday, Sunday or legal holiday, the next business day shall become the last day for filing. All papers sent by mail in an envelope postmarked prior to midnight of the last day of filing shall be deemed timely filed and accepted for filing when received, except any documents that are required to be filed with the board of elections of the city of New York must be actually received by such city board of elections on or before midnight of the last day to file any such document. Failure to do so shall be a fatal defect.

No filings will be accepted by facsimile or e-mail.

Candidates must file a certificate of acceptance for nominations made by independent nominating petitions, or if they are named in a designating petition but are not enrolled members of that party. Neither an authorization nor an acceptance is required if the individual is a candidate for a judicial office. A declination must be filed should the candidate decide not to accept the designation or nomination.

Objections

Every petition is presumed to be valid when filed, if, on its face, it appears to be in proper form and to contain enough signatures. However, a registered voter may challenge the validity of a petition. Written objections must be filed within 3 days after the petition is filed (1 day in a village election). For petitions filed with the State Board of Elections, objectors must deliver a copy of the specifications of objections to the candidate and file proof of such delivery with the State Board. For further details see Election Law §6-154 and §15-108 and Part 6204 of the rules and regulations of the State Board of Elections.

Who can carry and Independent Petition?

Any one who signed another petition for the same race **cannot** carry.

Any one who carried but did not sign a petition can carry.

Any one who is a registered voter in the state who did not sign or carry a petition can carry.

Who can sign an Independent Petition?

Signatures of registered voters of the political unit for which a nomination is made who are registered to vote. The name of the person signing such a petition for an election for which voters are required to be registered shall not be counted if the name of a person who has signed such a petition appears upon another valid and effective petition designating or nominating the same or a different person for the same office,

Vacancy Committee:

Vacancy committee is made up of at least 3 people who are registered voters.

PETITION OBJECTION INSTRUCTIONS

(2011)

The following petition rules and regulations pertain to the Broome County Board of Elections:

- Petitions may be photocopied by Board of Elections personnel upon written request and at the cost of \$.25 per page
- Any person who completes and submits to the Board of Elections a written request may examine petitions.
- No person examining any petition or certificate may use or have in his/her possession a pen or indelible pencil.
- No person or group may examine any petition or certificate for a period of more than two (2) consecutive hours if another person is waiting to examine the same petition or certificate.
- An examination of any petition or certificate shall be made only in the general office of the Board and in the presence of one or more employees of the Board.
- Specifications of objections shall be typewritten or **printed legibly** and filed in duplicate. Each objection shall be separately stated and numbered. Whenever reference is made to a specific signature such reference shall be by page and line number.
- The objection and specifications must be dated and signed and must contain the address and telephone number of the objector.

RULES PERTAINING TO DUPLICATE SIGNATURES

- As a general rule, if a person signs two petitions, the first one in time counts, and the second does not.
- Individuals may file opportunity to ballot petitions as early as the first permissible filing date for designating petitions.
- If an objection is properly raised alleging that a person signed both a designating petition and an opportunity to ballot petition for the same office, the Board will base its ruling on those petitions that have been filed prior to the date of the hearing on objections
- If a petition (designating or OTB) has been accepted for filing without any objection having been raised and an objection is properly raised regarding a different petition for that same office, the duplicate signature in the challenged petition shall not be counted, regardless of which petition was signed first.

Specification of objections to designating and independent nominating petitions:

- A.** Any person filing general objections to any designating or independent nominating petitions filed with the Broome County Board of Elections who thereafter files specifications of his objections to any such petition with such board shall do so in accordance with the provisions of Section 6-154 of the New York State Election Law. All such specifications; shall substantially comply with the following requirements:
1. The volume number, page number, line number and objection number of any signature objected to on any petition shall be set forth in detail per the attached format. In addition, any portion of any petition or any signature line or witness statement objected to shall be specifically identified and reasons give for any such objection;
 2. The total number of signatures objected to shall be set forth and all objections relating to a single signature line should be grouped together;
 3. Symbols and/or abbreviations may be used to set forth objections, provided that a sheet explaining the meaning of any such symbols and/or abbreviations are attached to the specifications
 4. The use of the pre-printed "Specifications of Objections" supplied by the Broome County Board of Elections shall, upon compliance with all other applicable requirements herein, be considered in proper form and therefore in compliance with these rules.
- B.** No specifications of objections to any petition will be considered by the Board unless the objector filing the specifications personally delivers or mailed by registered or certified mail a duplicate copy of the specifications to each candidate for public office named on the petition. In the case of a petition containing candidates for party position **or opportunity to ballot petitions**, service of the specifications shall be made on either **contact** or all members of committee to fill vacancies. Service shall be made on or before the date of filing of any specifications with the Board. Proof of such service shall be filed with the Board prior to the time of the hearing on the specifications.
- C.** Any notice and/or determination relating to a petition for which specifications of objections have been filed shall be transmitted by the Board to the objector filing the specifications, provided that any such objector may designate an attorney or agent to receive any such notice and/ or determination on his behalf. Any such designation shall be in writing and include the name, address and telephone number of any such attorney or agent and any such attorney or agent shall be eligible to represent any such objector in any proceeding conducted by the Board relating to the specifications. Specification of objections shall be typewritten **or printed legibly** and filed in duplicate.

New York State Election Law
6-154 Nominations and designations; objections to.

1. Any petition filed with the officer or board charged with the duty of receiving it shall be presumptively valid if it is in proper form and appears to bear the requisite number of signatures, authenticated in a manner prescribed by this chapter.
2. Written objections to any certificate of designation or nomination or to a nominating or designating petition or a petition for opportunity to ballot for public office or to a certificate of acceptance, certificate of authorization, a certificate of declination or a certificate of substitution relating thereto may be filed by any voter registered to vote for such public office and to a designating petition or a petition for opportunity to ballot for party position or a certificate of substitution, a certificate of acceptance or a certificate of declination relating thereto by any voter enrolled to vote for such party position. Such objection shall be filed with the officer or board with whom the original petition or certificate is filed within three days after the filing of the petition or certificate to which objection is made, or within three days after the last day to file such a certificate, if no such certificate is filed except that if any person nominated by an independent nominating petition, is nominated as a party candidate for the same office by a party certificate filed, or a party nomination made after the filing of such petition, the written objection to such petition may be filed within three days after the filing of such party certificate or the making of such party nomination. When such an objection is filed, specifications of the grounds of the objections shall be filed within six days thereafter with the same officer or board and if specifications are not timely filed, the objection shall be null and void. Each such officer or board is hereby empowered to make rules in reference to the filing and disposition of such petition, certificate, objections and specifications.
3. When a determination is made that a certificate or petition is insufficient, such officer or board shall give notice of determination forthwith by mail to each candidate named in the petition or certificate, and, if the determination is made upon specified objections, the objector shall be notified.

REVISED CAMPAIGN FINANCE LAW

Section 1. Section 14-100 of the election law is amended by adding three new subdivisions 12, 13 and 14 to read as follows:

12. "CLEARLY IDENTIFIED CANDIDATE" MEANS THAT:
 - (A) THE NAME OF THE CANDIDATE INVOLVED APPEARS;
 - (B) A PHOTOGRAPH OR DRAWING OF THE CANDIDATE APPEARS; OR
 - (C) THE IDENTITY OF THE CANDIDATE IS APPARENT BY UNAMBIGUOUS REFERENCE.

13. "GENERAL PUBLIC AUDIENCE" MEANS AN AUDIENCE COMPOSED OF MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC, INCLUDING A TARGETED SUBGROUP OF MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC; PROVIDED, HOWEVER, IT DOES NOT MEAN AN AUDIENCE SOLELY COMPRISED OF MEMBERS, RETIREES AND STAFF OF A LABOR ORGANIZATION OR MEMBERS OF THEIR HOUSEHOLDS OR AN AUDIENCE SOLELY COMPRISED OF EMPLOYEES OF A CORPORATION, UNINCORPORATED BUSINESS ENTITY OR MEMBERS OF A BUSINESS, TRADE OR PROFESSIONAL ASSOCIATION OR ORGANIZATION.

14. "LABOR ORGANIZATION" MEANS ANY ORGANIZATION OF ANY KIND WHICH EXISTS FOR THE PURPOSE, IN WHOLE OR IN PART, OF REPRESENTING EMPLOYEES EMPLOYED WITHIN THE STATE OF NEW YORK IN DEALING WITH EMPLOYERS OR EMPLOYER ORGANIZATIONS OR WITH A STATE GOVERNMENT, OR ANY POLITICAL OR CIVIL SUBDIVISION OR OTHER AGENCY THEREOF, CONCERNING TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF EMPLOYMENT, GRIEVANCES, LABOR DISPUTES, OR OTHER MATTERS INCIDENTAL TO THE EMPLOYMENT RELATIONSHIP. FOR THE PURPOSES OF THIS ARTICLE, EACH LOCAL, PARENT NATIONAL OR PARENT INTERNATIONAL ORGANIZATION OF A STATEWIDE LABOR ORGANIZATION, AND EACH STATEWIDE FEDERATION RECEIVING DUES FROM SUBSIDIARY LABOR ORGANIZATIONS, SHALL BE CONSIDERED A SEPARATE LABOR ORGANIZATION.

S 2. Intentionally omitted.

S 3. Section 14-106 of the election law, as amended by section 2 of part E of chapter 399 of the laws of 2011, is amended to read as follows:

S 14-106. Political communication. The statements required to be filed under the provisions of this article next succeeding a primary, general or special election shall be accompanied by a copy of all broadcast, cable or satellite schedules and scripts, internet, print and other types of advertisements, pamphlets, circulars, flyers, brochures, letterheads and other printed matter purchased or produced, AND REPRODUCTIONS OF STATEMENTS OR INFORMATION PUBLISHED TO FIVE HUNDRED OR MORE MEMBERS OF A GENERAL PUBLIC AUDIENCE BY COMPUTER OR OTHER ELECTRONIC DEVICE INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO ELECTRONIC MAIL OR TEXT MESSAGE, purchased in connection with such election by or under the authority of the person filing the statement or the committee or the person on whose behalf it is filed, as the case may be. Such copies, schedules and scripts shall be preserved by the officer with whom or the board with which it is required to be filed for a period of one year from the date of filing thereof.

CAMPAIGN FINANCE FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Registering

Q. Who has to file a financial filing?

A. Any candidate, or committee that raises and/or spends over \$1,000.00 MUST file a financial disclosure report. You must keep records of ALL expenditures and donations even if you are under \$1,000.00.

Q. How do I register as a candidate or committee?

A. Register with NYSBOE FIRST, BEFORE opening your account with the bank. All you need is the bank name to start a financial filing application. You also need to file a COPY with the appropriate county/city board(s) of elections by submitting, where applicable, CF-02, CF-03, CF-04, CF-05 and CF-16 forms. The applicable forms must be submitted by:

- A treasurer of a political committee; or
- A candidate with a registered authorized committee that would disclose all of the financial activity of the candidate's campaign including all of the financial activity of the candidate; or
- A candidate who does **not** have a registered authorized committee that would disclose all of the financial activity of the candidate's campaign, including the financial activity of the candidate; or
- A candidate who has a registered authorized committee, but chooses to have financial activity for the campaign that will not be disclosed by the authorized committee.

Note: Use these forms to register and obtain the required Filer ID# and PIN used to file electronically with NYSBOE.

Filing Reports Electronically

Q. Electronic Filing-How do I file reports electronically with NYSBOE?

A. Electronic filings may be submitted to NYSBOE by downloading the most recent version of NYSBOE's EFS software and preparing reports:

1. Go to the NYSBOE website at www.elections.ny.gov;
2. Click [Campaign Finance] then [File Disclosure Reports]
3. Click on the applicable Version 5.1 of NYSBOE Electronic Filing System Software;

4. Double Click the [Electronic Filing Program icon] created on your desktop after downloading;
5. Create a campaign financial disclosure report;
6. Print and save the report;
7. Submit reports to NYSBOE (via email attachment or mailing a diskette, CD or DVD);
and
8. Verify report for receipt and accuracy via the website www.elections.ny.gov.

Reporting

Q: No-Activity Report - If I have not had any campaign activity during a report period, do I need to file a report? If so, what and how do I file?

A: Yes, you still have to file. All candidates and/or registered committees are required to file January and July periodic reports until termination. Primary, General and Special Election filing requirements are triggered by candidate/committee activity. If the candidate/committee has had no activity, (i.e., receipts and/or expenditures, such as interest, dividends and bank charges) during any required reporting period, the candidate/committee is still required to file, in this instance a No-Activity Report. This report can be filed on the NYSBOE website using their Filer ID# and PIN or on paper using the Termination or Resignation Request Form/No-Activity Report Form CF-18.

Q: 24-Hour Notice - Must a 24-Hour Notice be filed when a campaign committee receives a transfer from a party or constituted committee?

A: No, 24-Hour Notices are only required for contributions or loans in excess of \$1000. Transfers are not contributions or loans. They are an exchange of funds or anything of value between political committees authorized by the same candidate and taking part solely in his/her campaign, or any exchange of funds between a party or constituted committee and candidate or any of his/her authorized committees.

Q: "Bounced Checks" - How should a contribution that is returned for insufficient funds, (a "bounced" check) be reported?

A: The receipt of the check was reported on the appropriate contribution schedule (A, B, or C), which increased the committee's balance. The returned check is then reported on Schedule M, which decreases the committee's balance.

Q: Letters of Indebtedness/Forgiveness - Are candidates required to submit letters of indebtedness or forgiveness if they loaned their campaign money?

A: Yes, evidence of indebtedness/forgiveness must be submitted for any loans received from candidates and their family members.

Q: PayPal - How should contributions using PayPal (or another company where the recipient is charged a fee) be reported?

A: The total contribution is reported on the applicable schedule (A, B, or C), then the fee charged by PayPal would be reported on Schedule F under "Other" code with explanation (PayPal service charge/transaction fee).

Q: Report Balance - Are there any schedules that do not affect the report cash balance.

A: Schedules K, N, O, R, and D do not affect the cash balance of the report. These schedules perform a record-keeping function, can serve as a tool for filers and are informational schedules.

Signatures

Q: Signatures - Can NYSBOE accept copies or facsimiles of signatures on registration or other forms?

A: No, original signatures are required. Copies of signatures, including those on faxes, PDFs, or other electronic files are not acceptable.

Campaigning

Q: "Paid for By" - When does a campaign have to use the term "paid for by ..." in political advertisements?

A: NYS Election Law does not require attribution, where the sponsor's or payer's name is on any political advertisements ("paid for by"). However, if the ad refers to a federal candidate, the Federal Election Commission (FEC) does impose such a requirement. Additionally, Federal Communications Commission (FCC) regulations, radio/TV stations, and print media themselves, may impose an attribution requirement. Please consult with these appropriate federal authorities or media outlets for further information.

Fundraising

Q: Door Prizes - How should we report contributions given to the campaign in the form of door prizes?

A: Items contributed by individuals or businesses must be reported as in-kind (non-monetary) contributions on Schedule D. The value of in-kind contributions must be reported at fair market value. Aggregate contributions (all contributions from one contributor) greater than \$99 must be itemized, reporting contributor's name, address and any other required details.

Q: Raffles - What are the rules regarding raffles, "50-50s" or any other games of chance as to campaign fundraising?

A: Raffles, "50-50s" or any other games of chance are illegal and not allowed for campaign finance purposes under NYS Racing, Pari-Mutuel Wagering and Breeding Law. For further information, contact the NYS Gaming Commission, (518) 395-5400, or the Attorney General, (518) 474-7330.

Campaign Materials

Q: Campaign Materials - What are the requirements for submitting campaign materials to NYSBOE?

A: Any filer required to file primary, general and/or special election reports must, at the same time the applicable post-election campaign financial disclosure report is due, submit copies of all the filer's campaign materials, purchased or produced by or under the authority of the person filing the post-election report, or the committee or the person on whose behalf it is filed.

Campaign materials include all broadcast, cable or satellite schedules and scripts, internet, print and other types of advertisements, pamphlets, circulars, flyers, brochures, letterheads and other printed matter.

Submissions of campaign materials:

- Can include duplicate originals (e.g., posters, flyers, buttons, etc.) or legible photocopies;
- Must be hard copies, not electronic/digital files; and
- May be photographed when, for practical purposes they cannot be readily reproduced in a paper copy because they are large, unwieldy items. (e.g., billboards, sandwich boards, etc.).

Penalties

Q: Correspondence/Legal Documents - What should a treasurer/candidate do if he/she receives correspondence/legal documents from NYSBOE.

A: If you receive a letter or are served with legal documents from NYSBOE, do not ignore them. Contact NYSBOE immediately. There are significant consequences, for both treasurers and candidate, which may include penalties for failure to comply with the requirements of the NYS Election Law relating to campaign finance. Call NYSBOE at 1-800-458-3453 or (518)474-8200.

FINANCIAL DISCLOSURE REQUIREMENTS:

The New York State Election Law requires candidates and political committees to file statements disclosing information about contributions received and expenditures made in connection with an election.

The forms required to register a committee and to report receipts and disbursements, as well as a comprehensive handbook of instructions, are available at the State Board of Elections and your county Board of Elections.

MEMORANDUM: I.R.S. FILING REQUIREMENTS

I. TYPE OF COMMITTEE OR POLITICAL ORGANIZATION

A. State - local candidate committees, multi-candidate committees and party committees:

Do not have to file anything with the I.R.S., unless they have taxable income (e.g., interest and dividends) over \$100. In that case, they only have to file Form 1120-POL, "U.S. Income Tax Return for Certain Political Organizations". (This form must be filed by the 15th day of the third month following the close of the organization's taxable year; usually March 15th).

B. PACs and all others (including caucuses or an association of state or local officials):

1. If they file with the F.E.C., or have gross receipts of less than \$25,000:

Do not have to file anything with the I.R.S., unless they have taxable income (e.g., interest and dividends) over \$100. In that case, they only have to file Form 1120-POL, "U.S. Income Tax Return for Certain Political Organizations".

2. If they do not file with the F.E.C. and have gross receipts of \$25,000 or more:

They may have to file one or more of the following forms -

Form 8871 ("Political Organization Notice of Section 527 Status") - Must be filed except if tax-exempt under Section 501 (c) of the I.R.S. Code as having taxable income under section 527 (f) (1); or do not seek tax exempt status.

Form 8872 ("Political Organization Report of Contributions/Expenditures") - Must be filed **except** if do not have to file Form 8871; or if subject to tax as did not file/amend, when required, Form 8871; or if a qualified state or local political organization (**QSLPO**). Organizations, other than **QSLPOs**, that file Form 8871 must file Form 8872. The exception for QSLPOs is significant for state/local PACs/others with gross receipts of \$25,000 or more that do not file with the F.E.C. - if they meet all requirements of a QSLPO, they do not have to file Form 8872. **QSLPO criteria:** **1)** All political activities relate solely to state or local public office or office in a state or local political organization; **2)** Org. is subject to state law that requires it to report (and it does) to a state agency about contributions/expenditures similar to information it would otherwise be required to report to the I.R.S. (Note: county filing pursuant to state law are deemed filed with the state); **3)** The state agency and the organization make

the report publicly available; and **4**) No Federal Candidate or office holder controls it or materially participates in its direction, solicits contributions for it, or directs any of its disbursements.

Form 990/990EZ (“Return of Organization Exempt From Income Tax”) - Unless fall within an exception, must file if have gross receipts of \$25,000/more for the taxable year, or \$100,000 if a **QSLPO**. Form 990/990EZ used if gross receipts are less than \$100,000 and assets are less than \$250,000 at end of year. **Exceptions:** Do not file if not required to file Form 8871; or are a caucus or association of state or local officials. State/local PACs, or others that are not a caucus or association of state or local officials, that meet the definition of QSLPO and have gross receipts less than \$100,000, do not have to file Form 990. If they do not meet the requirements of a **QSLPO** and have gross receipts of \$25,000/more, then they have to file Form 990.

Form 1120-POL (“U.S. Income Tax Return for Certain Political Organizations”) - Must be filed only if have taxable income over \$100 in a taxable year (e.g. interest, dividends, rents and other types of receipts). (There is a specific deduction of \$100.) Includes tax-exempt political organizations that do not have gross receipts of a least \$25,000.

II. DETAILS ON CERTAIN FILING REQUIREMENTS

Form 8871 (“Political Organization Notice of Section 527 Status”) - This form, which must be filed electronically, is only required to be filed once, within 24 hours after the committee is established, or the next business day following a weekend/legal holiday. After it has been filed, if there is a material change in information, including termination, an amended form must be filed within 30 days of the material change.

Form 8872 (“Political Organization Report of Contributions/Expenditures”) - This form must be filed monthly or quarterly in any year in which there is a regularly scheduled federal general election held (even numbered years); Semiannually or monthly in all other years (odd numbered years). The organization can opt for either monthly or quarterly filings or semiannual or monthly filings as the case may be, but it must file on the same basis for the entire calendar year. There are also pre-election and post-election report filing requirements which impact the filing option chosen, and which are explained in greater detail on the I.R.S. Instruction for Form 8872.

Form 990/990EZ (“Return of Organization Exempt From Income Tax”) - This form must be filed on the 15th day of the 5th month after the end of the organizations taxable year. There is a penalty for failure to file this form. There is a three month extension available, without cause, upon filing the requisite form, and an additional extension available, with cause, upon filing the requisite form.

Form 1120-POL (“U.S. Income Tax Return for Certain Political Organizations”) - This form must be filed by the 15th day of the third month following the close of the organization’s taxable year, usually March 15th.

Note: The I.R.S. website www.irs.gov should be consulted for specific details/explanations.

August 26th - September 8th: during this time period any contribution or loan which EXCEEDS \$1,000 must be reported within 24 hours of receipt and must also be reported in the post-election report.

For those candidates and committees involved in the General Election, to be held on November 4, 2014, there are three reports due to be filed as follows:

32 day pre-general	October 3, 2014	September 29, 2014
11 day pre-general	October 24, 2014	October 20, 2014
27 day post-general	December 1, 2014	November 27, 2014

October 21st - November 3rd: during this time period, any contribution or loan which EXCEEDS \$1,000 must be reported within 24 hours of receipt and must also be reported in the post-election report.

2.
 - A. Under Section 14-126 of the NYS Election Law, penalties may be imposed as follows:
'Any person who fails to file a statement required to be filed by this article shall be subject to a civil penalty, not in excess of five hundred dollars.'
 - B. 'Any person who knowingly and willfully fails to file a statement required to be filed by this article within ten days after the date provided for filing such statement shall be guilty of a misdemeanor.'
3. The following policy shall be effective for 2014:
 - A. Depending on who you file with, financial disclosures are expected to be filed with the State Board of Elections (\$ 1,000 or more) and/or Broome County Board of Elections (\$ 1,000 or less) pursuant to the dates required by law.
 - B. If, after seven (7) calendar days a report by a committee or candidate has not been filed with the State Board of Elections and/or Broome County Board of Elections, a formal five (5) day letter shall be sent by first class mail to the Treasurer and Candidate of said committee notifying them of failure to comply with Election Law Article 14.
 - C. If a filing date or deadline falls on a weekend or holiday, the next filing day shall be the next business day.
 - D. The New York State Board of Election Handbook of Instructions for Campaign Financial Disclosure is available for your information and use. For electronic filers and anyone else desiring information from the State Board, you may visit their website at www.elections.ny.gov

Please be advised that political contributions are not tax deductible for Federal income tax purposes.

- A final itemized campaign financial disclosure report must be filed using the Electronic Filing System (EFS) Software, whether filed as an attachment to an email, filed by mail on diskette, CD or DVD, or a non-itemized campaign financial disclosure report (i.e., No-Activity Report) must be filed online at www.elections.ny.gov or by paper using this [CF-18](#) form, if applicable.
- All previously required campaign financial disclosure reports must have been filed to date.
- The committee bank account must have an ending cash balance of \$0, which also must be reflected in the filer's final financial disclosure report.
- All outstanding loans or liabilities must have been repaid or forgiven, and required letters of forgiveness/ indebtedness must have been submitted to the appropriate board(s).

No-Activity Report (non-itemized campaign financial disclosure report): The Electronic Filing System (EFS) Software does not accommodate the filing of No-Activity Reports. Therefore, electronic filers with NYSBOE can either submit a fully completed paper request form ([CF-18](#) Termination or Resignation Request Form/ No-Activity Report Form) to file a No-Activity Report or submit a [No-Activity Report online](#).

Notes about termination: Termination can be requested with Periodic, Post-Primary, Post-General and Post -Special Election report filings. Termination can also be requested with an Off-Cycle report, which is defined as a report which does not correspond to any specific filing period. All applicable reports must continue to be filed until termination is approved by NYSBOE. Termination with a local board of elections does not constitute termination with NYSBOE.
