



## Transportation Options for Seniors Age 60 and Older

### **BC Transit City Buses**

City buses run on scheduled routes Monday through Sunday in the urban areas of Broome County. All city buses are accessible for people using mobility aids. **Call 763-4464 for schedules** or access information online at [www.gobroomecounty.com/transit/routes](http://www.gobroomecounty.com/transit/routes).

The regular bus fare is \$2.00 per ride. Seniors, age 65 and over with appropriate ID, ride for a reduced rate of \$1.00. **Call Office for Aging for an OFA ID card - 778-2411.** Discounted, multi-ride passes are available. Call 763-4464 for bus pass information.

### **The Office for Aging Mini-Bus**

The OFA Mini-bus provides seniors, age 60 and over, with curb-to-curb transportation from 9:00 am to 4:00 pm Monday through Friday. You make a reservation for the bus to pick you up at your home and deliver you to your destination. You must make a second reservation if you want the bus to take you home again.

The OFA Mini-Bus serves seniors living in the urban areas of Broome County; this includes Binghamton, Johnson City, Vestal, Endicott, Endwell, Chenango Bridge and parts of Kirkwood and Conklin. **Seniors needing an OFA ID card can call 778-2411** for an application or an application can be printed from the website: [www.gobroomecounty.com/senior/trans](http://www.gobroomecounty.com/senior/trans).

**To make a reservation, call 763-8747** Monday through Friday between 8:00 am and 4:00 pm. You can make reservations no sooner than one week in advance but no later than one business day before your ride. BC Transit calls the afternoon before the requested ride to confirm whether you are getting your ride. Rides are distributed on a first come first served basis.

With an OFA ID card, you can ride the OFA Mini-Bus at the voluntary contribution rate of \$1.50 per each one-way trip. Contributions are appreciated and help to assure the continuation of this service. Riders with an OFA ID card are not denied service due to an inability or unwillingness to contribute. Your reservation may include 1-2 guests. Guests under age 60 are charged \$2.50. Guests 60 or over pay the \$1.50 suggested contribution, with an OFA ID card.

Individuals whose income is at or above 185 % of the Federal Poverty Guidelines are asked to contribute at an amount that represents the actual costs of the rides (**\$2.75 per ride**). You are asked to contribute at this rate if your monthly household income is more than \$1,815 and you live alone; or if you live in a household of 2 and your monthly income exceeds \$2,456.

## **BC Country**

BC Country is a curb-to-curb service serving the rural regions of the county. BC Country buses transport rural residents to the urban area of the county in the morning and make a return trip in the afternoon. The hours and days of operation vary depending on the region. For more information on scheduling, call 763-4464.

Seniors age 60 and over **with an OFA ID card** ride BC Country at the voluntary contribution rate of \$1.50 per trip. Riders with an OFA ID card are not denied service due to an inability or unwillingness to contribute.

You need to make a reservation for every one-way trip you take on BC Country. **To make a reservation, call 763-8747** Monday through Friday between 8:00 am and 4:00 pm. You can make reservations no sooner than one week in advance but no later than **two** business days before your ride. BC Transit calls the afternoon before the requested ride to confirm whether you are getting your ride. Rides are distributed on a first come first served basis.

## **The BC Lift**

Broome County residents who cannot ride the fixed route bus due to a doctor-verified disability can ride the BC Lift. The BC Lift runs from 5:30 am to 10:00 pm Monday through Friday, Saturday from 5:30 am to 6:30 pm, and Sunday from 9:00 am to 5:30 pm. You make a reservation for the bus to pick you up at your home and deliver you to your destination. You make a second reservation for the bus to take you home again.

The BC Lift is a curb-to-curb service for seniors living in the urban areas of Broome County; this includes Binghamton, Johnson City, Vestal, Endicott, Endwell, Chenango Bridge and parts of Kirkwood and Conklin. You need to be able to get to and from the vehicle by yourself. If you use a wheelchair, you need to be able to get on and off the wheelchair lift without the driver's assistance.

Riders need a BC Lift card (**also called an ADA or Americans with Disabilities Act card**) to ride. You can download an application at [www.gobroomecounty.com/transit/pdfs/BCLiftApplication](http://www.gobroomecounty.com/transit/pdfs/BCLiftApplication) or call **763-4464**. The application process for the card can take four to six weeks.

Fares for the BC Lift are \$2.50 for each one-way trip. You need to make a reservation for each trip. **To make a reservation, call 763-8747** Monday through Friday between 8:00 am and 4:00 pm. You can make reservations no sooner than one week in advance but no later than one business day before your ride. BC Transit calls the afternoon before the requested ride to confirm whether you are getting your ride. Rides are distributed on a first come first served basis.

**Rides for seniors on the OFA Mini-bus and BC Country are supported with money from the Administration on Aging, the NYS Office for Aging, and the Broome County Office for Aging.**
