Rules & Regulations:

This contest is open to all students enrolled in Pre-K through 12th grade.

Students may submit their artwork as an individual or as group from a class or small group (perfect for young students or small therapeutic groups!).

Submissions must be two dimensional and submitted through a photograph or JPEG.

Artwork must have a title.

Guardian permission will be requested if the submission is selected as a Top Ten for the community to vote on.

Accepted Mediums:

- Paintings: oil, acrylics, watercolor, etc.
- Drawings: colored pencil, pencil, ink, marker, pastels, charcoal (It is recommended that charcoal and pastel drawings be fixed.)
- Collages
- Prints: lithographs, silkscreen, block prints
- Mixed Media: use of more than two mediums such as pencil, ink, watercolor, etc.
- Computer-generated art

Objective

The purpose of our art contest is for Broome County students to bring our theme to life.

The theme for 2022 is *Making Room at Our Table*.

- inclusion,

When preparing to cast your vote, ask yourself: “**which submission best represents the theme of Making Room at Our Table?”**”

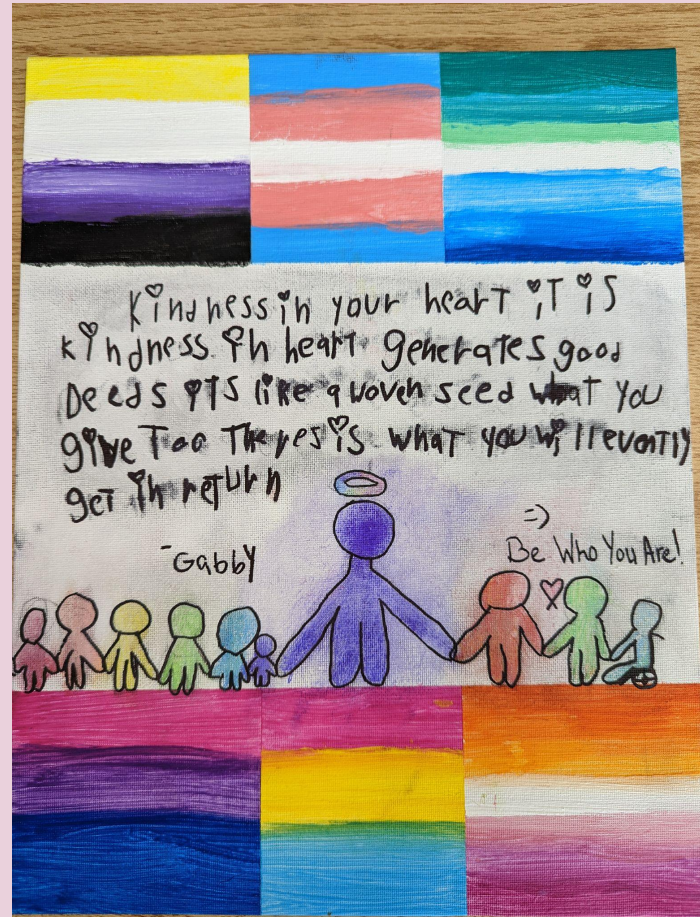
Full Council Voting

The Top Ten submissions will be given to the community to vote on for their favorite.

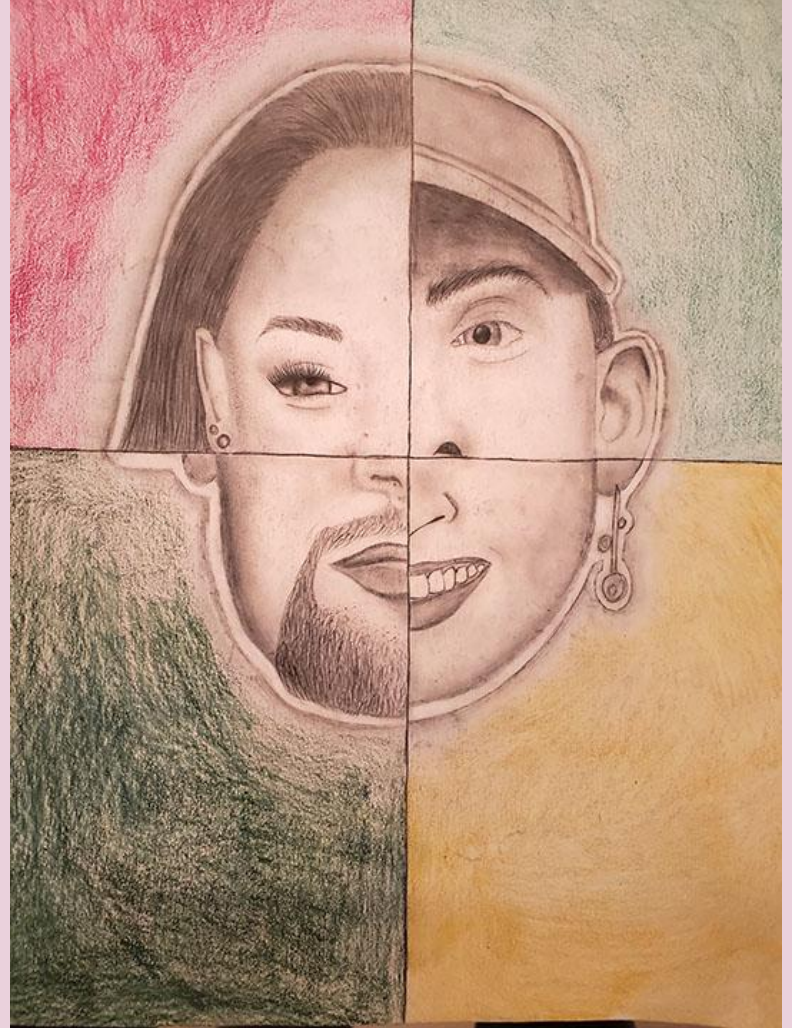

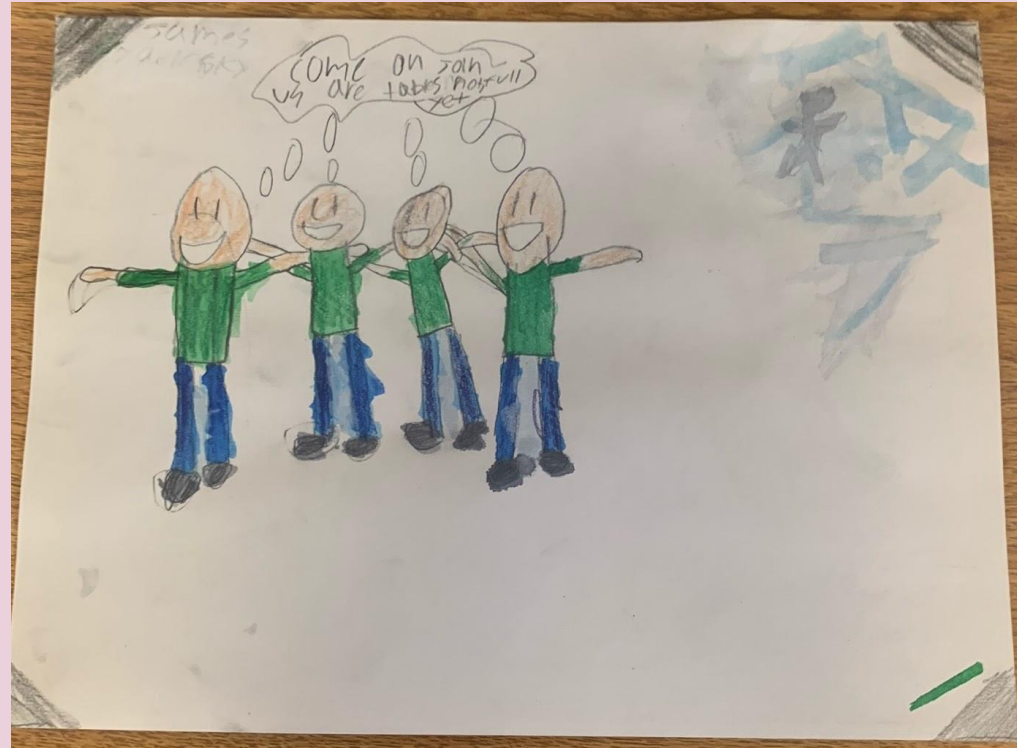
The child helped her mom who was busy helping other children. So the kid took a step forward and made the table to make her mom’s job a bit quicker.
