Artwork must have a title.

Guardian permission will be requested if the submission is selected as a Top Ten for the community to vote on.

Accepted Mediums:

• Paintings: oil, acrylics, watercolor, etc.

• Drawings: colored pencil, pencil, ink, marker, pastels, charcoal (It is recommended that charcoal and pastel drawings be fixed.)

- Collages
- Prints: lithographs, silkscreen, block prints
- Mixed Media: use of more than two mediums such as pencil, ink, watercolor, etc.
- Computer-generated art

- acceptance


When preparing to cast your vote, ask yourself: "which submission best represents the theme of <u>Making Room</u> <u>at Our Table</u>?"


- 1. Review the following slides containing photographs of the submitted artwork.
