FUNDING: TREE CITY USA AND TREE CAMPUS

Tree City, Tree Campus, and Tree Line are programs coordinated by The National Arbor Day Foundation (ADF) in cooperation with the USDA Forest Service and DEC's Urban and Community Forestry program. These programs provide direction, public attention, and national recognition for urban and community forestry programs in thousands of towns and cities that more than 93 million Americans call home.

The standards required for each certification program will help a community, school, or utility get started with annual planning and management of its tree resources. Participants build relationships with DEC urban forestry program staff and the NYS Urban Forestry Council, which will help support a fledgling urban forestry program. <u>More info here.</u>

The NYS Urban Forestry Council is pleased to announce available funding for communities to hold a tree planting event in the spring of 2025 celebrating Arbor Day and to establish a community-based forestry program. Communities can apply for up to \$1,000. Funding has been provided by the NYS Urban Forestry Council and the USDA Forest Service.

Grant Goals:

COMMUNITY: TIER ENERGY NETWORK

<u>Tier Energy Network (TEN)</u> is updating its map on clean energy companies and organizations in the Southern Tier. The map can help educate the community and schools on the emerging industry cluster in clean energy. It also serves as a reference for businesses and start-up companies seeking opportunities. TEN provides presentations in the community. Our monthly membership meeting has provided opportunities for companies, start-ups and organizations to make presentations. TEN also provides a monthly review of energy market developments, regulations and status of the ISO list of projects. TEN is supporting a long-term energy storage technology developed at Lehigh University. We are seeking partners to test the technology.

<u>The Southern Tier Land Conservancy</u> will hold their annual meeting and celebration of our first properties on Saturday, March 22 at Cornell Cooperative Extension.

COMMUNITY: ENVI. SUST. ROTARY GROUP

<u>Environmental Sustainability Rotary Action Group</u>, ESRAG has nominated the "Connected Communities" project on Cape Cod to the 2025 Earthshot Competition. The "Connected Communities" concept provides net zero solutions for carbon emissions and water discharge. The project has received \$175 million in funding from the State of Massachusetts. The proposal to Earthshot scales the project to areas in the Northeast and developing countries. The list of partners is significant. ESRAG members from the Southern Tier and Cape Cod have been collaborating for over 3 years. ESRAG for Eastern North America offers monthly presentations that are open to the public. Projects are spun off for separate funding opportunities. Both regions are now exploring the potential of Biochar.

COMMUNITY: NY WATER BASIN TRAIL

The <u>NY Susquehanna Water Basin Water Trail</u> will be officially announced at the General Clinton Canoe Regatta. This Federally sponsored trail will span 190 miles from Cooperstown to the Finger Lakes. We seek projects and events to increase public use of this natural asset. The Susquehanna River is the 5th oldest river in the world at over 300 million years.

COMMUNITY: BU CLIMATE SUMMIT

The next Climate Summit by <u>Binghamton 2 Degrees</u> will take place on April 11. 




COMMUNITY: EARTH DAY FESTIVAL
