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
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

B 1.Total Population, New York State, Census 2010



B 2. Population Density, New York State, Census 2010




B 3. Total Population by Quartiles, New York State, Census 2010





B 7. Median Age, New York State, Census 2010









B 13. Population Trend for Black Non-Hispanics, Broome County, NY, 2000-2012











B 21. Median Family Income, New York State Census, 2010



B 22. Median Household Income, New York State Census, 2010








B 24. Percent of Households with Income Over \$10,000, New York State Census, 2010




B 25. Percent of Households with Income Over \$100,000, New York State Census, 2010









B 31. Percentage of Population at or Below Poverty Level, Broome County (single year), 2001-2010 [Crude Rate]



B 32. Percent of Individuals in Poverty, New York State Census, 2010




B 33. Percentage of Children at or Below Poverty Level (age <18 years), Broome County (single year), 2001-2010 [Crude Rate]




B 34. Percent of Individuals 18 and Over in Poverty, New York State Census, 2010




B 35. Percent of Individuals 65 and Over in Poverty, New York State Census, 2010

B 37. Percent of Population at or Below Poverty Level, 2010









B 44. Percentage of Labor Force Unemployed (single year), Broome County & Upstate New York, 2002-2011 [Crude Rate]



Percentage of labor force Counties Are Shaded Based On Quartile Distribution



B 48. Percent Female Labor Force Participation, New York State Census, 2010







B 51. High School Drop Out Rate, 2008-2010




Percentage of high school students Counties Are Shaded Based On Quartile Distribution








B 53. Percent High School Education as Highest Attainment, New York State Census 2010



B 54. Percent Bachelor's Degree or Higher, New York State Census 2010










B 59. Percent of Single Units, Detached, New York State Census, 2010




B 60. Percent of Single Family Units, New York State Census, 2010




B 61. Percent of Housing Units in Structures with 10+ Units, New York State Census, 2010









B 63. Percent Owner Occupied Units, New York State Census, 2010




B 64. Percent Renter Occupied Units, New York State Census, 2010




B 65. Average Household Size, New York State Census, 2010




B 66. Percent of Housing Units Where Householder Moved in Before 1970, New York State Census, 2010




B 67. Percent of Housing Units Where Householder Moved in Since 2005, New York State Census, 2010




B 68. Percent of Households with No Vehicles, New York State Census, 2010




B 69. Percent of Households with 3 or More Vehicles, New York State Census, 2010








B 71. Percent of Households with Electric Heat, New York State Census, 2010




B 72. Percent of Households with No Plumbing Facilities, New York State Census, 2010




B 73. Percent of Households with No Kitchen, New York State Census, 2010








B 75. Median Value of Housing Units, New York State Census, 2010




B 76. Percent of Housing Units Valued Under \$50,000, New York State Census, 2010




B 77. Percent of Housing Units Valued over \$300,000, New York State Census, 2010





B 86. Percent Recent Entrants (2000-2010). New York State Census, 2010






B 87. Percent Foreign Born, New York State Census, 2010











B 93. Disability among Adults, Broome County, NY, 2008-2009











B 103. Birth Rate, Broome County (single year & 3-year average) & Upstate New York, 2001-2010 [Crude Rate]






B 105. Births within 24 Months of Previous Pregnancy, 2008-2010



B 106. Percentage of Births to Teens (age 15-17), Broome County (single year & 3-year average) & Upstate New York, 2001-2010 [Crude Rate]




B 107. Percentage of Births to Teens (age 15-19), Broome County (single year & 3-year average) & Upstate New York, 2001-2010 [Crude Rate]





B 108. Percentage of Births to Teens (age 15-19), 2008-2010




B 109. Adolescent Birth Rates by Zip Code




B 110. Percentage of Births to Women 25 Years and Older Without High School Education, 2008-2010






B 112. Percentage of Births to Women 35 Years and Older, 2008-2010






B 114. Fertility Rate per 1,000 Females (age 15-44), 2008-2010






B 116. Teen Fertility Rate per 1,000 (Births to Mothers ages 10-14 years/Female Population ages 10-14 years), 2008- 2010






B 118. Teen Fertility Rate per 1,000, (Births to Mothers ages 15-17/Female Population ages 15-17, 2008-2010






B 120. Teen Fertility Rate per 1,000, (Births to Mothers ages 15-19/Female Population ages 15-19), 2008-2010






B 122. Teen Fertility Rate per 1,000, (Births to Mothers ages 18-19/Female Population ages 18-19), 2008-2010






B 124. Pregnancy Rate per 1,000 Females (age 15-44), 2008-2010






B 126. Teen Pregnancy Rate per 1,000 Females (ages 10-14 years), 2008-2010






B 128. Teen Pregnancy Rate per 1,000, 15-17 years, 2008-2010






B 131. Abortion Ratio (all ages) Broome County (single year & 3-year average) & Upstate New York, 2001-2010 [Crude Rate]




B 132. Abortion Ratio, Induced Abortions per 100 Live Births (all ages), 2008-2010





B 135. Adolescent Pregnancy Rates by Zip Code, Broome County, NY, 2009-2011





B 136. Total Hospitalization Rate per 10,000, Broome County (single year & 3-year average) & Upstate New York, 2001-2010 [Crude Rate]









B 144. Total Mortality Rate per 100,000, Broome County (single year & 3-year average) & Upstate New York, 2001-2010 [Crude Rate]




B 145. Total Mortality Rate per 100,000, 2008-2010








B 148. Percentage Premature Deaths (ages <75 Years), 2008-2010






B 150. Fatal Work Related Injuries per 100,000 Employed Persons Aged 16 and Older, 2009-2011































B 168. Cancer Screening among Women [Age-Adjusted], Broome County, New York State, 2009




B 169. Ever Had a Mammogram among Women Aged 40 and Older, Broome County, NY, 2008-2009




B 170. Had a Mammogram within the Past 2 Years among Women Aged 40 and Older, Broome County, NY, 2008-2009




B 171. Had a Mammogram within the Past 2 Years among Women Aged 50 and Older, Broome County, NY, 2008-2009




B 172. Percentage of Women, 40 Years of Age and Older With Mammography Screening in the Past Two Years, 2008-2009




B 173. Ever Had a Pap Test among Women, Broome County, NY, 2008-2009




B 174. Had a Pap Test within the Past 3 Years among Women, Broome County, NY, 2008-2009




B 175. Age-adjusted Percentage of Women, 18 Years of Age and Older With Pap Smear in Past Three Years, 2008-2009




B 176. Ever Had Blood Cholesterol Checked among Adults Aged 50 and Older, Broome County, NY, 2008-2009



B 177. Blood Cholesterol Checked within the Past 5 Years among Adults Aged 50 and Older, Broome County, NY, 2008-2009




B 178. Age-adjusted Percentage of Adults with Cholesterol Checked in the Last Five Years, 2008-2009




B 179. High Blood Pressure among Adults Aged 50 and Older, Broome County, NY, 2008-2009




B 180. Blood Pressure Medication among Adults Aged 50 and Older, Broome County, NY, 2008-2009




B 181. Age-adjusted Percentage of Adults Ever Told They Have High Blood Pressure, 2008-2009




B 182. Colon Cancer Screening among Adults [Age-Adjusted], Broome County, New York State, 2009




B 183. Ever Had a Digital Rectal Exam among Men Aged 40 and Older, Broome County, NY, 2008-2009




B 184. Had a Digital Rectal Exam within the Past 2 Years among Men Aged 40 and Older, Broome County, NY, 2008-2009




B 185. Home Blood Stool Test Ever Used among Adults Aged 50 and Older, Broome County, NY, 2008-2009




B 186. Home Blood Stool Test Used within the Past Year among Adults Aged 50 and Older, Broome County, NY, 2008-2009




B 187. Home Blood Stool Test Used within the Past 2 Years among Adults Aged 50 and Older, Broome County, NY, 2008-2009




B 188. Ever Had a Sigmoidoscopy or Colonoscopy among Adults Aged 50 and Older, Broome County, NY, 2008-2009




B 189. Sigmoidoscopy or Colonoscopy within the Past 10 Years among Adults Aged 50 and Older, Broome County, NY, 2008-2009








B 192. Ever Had a Prostate Specific Antigen Test among Men Aged 40 and Older, Broome County, NY, 2008-2009









B 196. Asthma Hospitalization Rate per 10,000, 2008-2010







B 198. Asthma Hospitalization Rate per 10,000 (age 0-4), 2008-2010







B 200. Asthma Hospitalization Rate per 10,000 (age 5-14), 2008-2010







B 202. Asthma Hospitalization Rate per 10,000 (age 0-17), 2008-2010





B 203. Asthma Hospitalization Rate per 10,000 (age 5-64), 2008-2010





B 204. Asthma Hospitalization Rate per 10,000 (age 15-24), 2008-2010





B 205. Asthma Hospitalization Rate per 10,000 (age 25-44), 2008-2010





B 206. Asthma Hospitalization Rate per 10,000 (age 45-64), 2008-2010





B 207. Asthma Hospitalization Rate per 10,000 (age 65+), 2008-2010





B 208. Ever Diagnosed with Asthma (lifetime) among Adults, Broome County, NY, 2008-2009





B 209. Current Asthma among Adults, Broome County, NY, 2008-2009







B 211. Gastroenteritis Hospitalization Rate per 10,000 (age 0-4), 2008-2010







B 213. Otitis Media Hospitalization Rate per 10,000 (age 0-4), 2008-2010




