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
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

E 1. General Health among Adults [Age-Adjusted], Broome County, NYS, 2009




E 2. Fair or Poor General Health among Adults, Broome County, NY, 2008-2009




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
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
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
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
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


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
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


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
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


Age-adjusted percentage of adults Counties Are Shaded Based On Quartile Distribution




E 15. Physical Activity among Adolescents, New York State, United States, 2011




E 16. Television Viewing More than Three Hours per Day among Adolescents, New York State, United States, 1999-2011





E 20. Percentage Overweight but not Obese (85th < 95th Percentile) (Elementary Students), 2008-2010





E 21. Percentage Overweight or Obese (85th Percentile or Higher) (Elementary Students), 2008-2010








E 23. Percentage Overweight but not Obese (85th<95th Percentile) All Students (Elementary, Middle and High School), 2008-2010



E 24. Percentage Overweight or Obese (85th Percentile or Higher) All Students (Elementary, Middle and High School), 2008-2010




E 25. Percentage Obese (95th Percentile or Higher) All Students (Elementary, Middle and High School Students), 2008-2010





E 26. Percentage Overweight but not Obese (85th < 95th Percentile) (Middle and High School Students), 2008-2010





E 28. Percentage Obese (95th Percentile or Higher) (Middle and High School Students), 2008-2010







E 30. Overweight & Obesity among Elementary School Children by School District, Broome County, NY, 2010-2012





E 31. Overweight & Obesity among Middle & High School Children by School District, Broome County, NY, 2010-2012





E 32. Overweight & Obesity among Youth and Adolescents, Broome County, Upstate New York, United States, 2010-2012





E 33. Percentage Obese (95th Percentile or Higher Children in WIC (ages 2-4 years) 2008-2010






E 35. Overweight & Obesity among Adults, Broome County, Upstate New York, United States, 2010-2012






E 40. Age-adjusted Percentage of Adults Overweight or Obese (BMI 25 or higher), 2008-2009












E 48. Drug Related Hospitalization Rate per 10,000 Population, 2008-2010




E 49. Smoking among Adults [Age-Adjusted], Broome County, NYS, 2009




E 50. Current Smoking among Adults, Broome County, NY, 2008-2009




E 52. Smoking Status among Adults, New York State, 1995-2012





E 53. Prevalence of Smoking during Pregnancy, Broome County, 2005-2011



E 54. Age-adjusted Percentage of Adults who Smoke Cigarettes, 2008-2009




E 55. Adults Living in Homes in which Smoking Is Prohibited, Broome County, NY, 2008-2009





E 57. Cigarette Use (past month) among 7th to 12th Grade Students, Broome County, 2002-2012






E 59. Heavy Cigarette Use (½ pack per day) among 7th to 12th Grade Students, Broome County, 2002-2012



E 60. Binge Drinking among Adults [Age-Adjusted], Broome County, NYS, 2009





E 61. Binge Drinking within the Past Month among Adults, Broome County, NY, 2008-2009





E 62. Binge Drinking among Adults, New York State, United States, 1995-2012



E 63. Age-adjusted Percentage of Adults who Binge Drink, 2008-2009




E 64. At Least One Drink of Alcohol in the Past Month among Adults, New York State, United States, 1995-2012





E 65. Heavy Drinking within the Past Month among Adults, Broome County, NY, 2008-2009





E 66. Heavy Drinking among Adults, New York State, United States, 2001-2012





E 67. Alcohol Use (past month) among 7th to 12th Grade Students, Broome County, 2002-2012





E 68. Binge Drinking among 7th to 12th Grade Students, Broome County, 2002-2012





E 69. Marijuana Use (past month) among 7th to 12th Grade Students, Broome County, 2002-2012



E 70. Antisocial Behavior (past year) among 7th to 12th Grade Students, Broome County, 2012




E 71. Chronic Disease: Musculoskeletal Conditions [Age-Adjusted], Broome County, New York State, 2009







E 80. Age-adjusted Percentage of Adults with Physician Diagnosed Angina, Heart Attack or Stroke, 2008-2009







E 85. Perceptions about Walking Distance & Safety in Broome County, 2007-2008





Would you say the walk is safe or unsafe?




E 87. Parks & Recreational Facilities, Broome County, NY




E 88. City of Binghamton Areas within Walking Distance of Education Facilities




E 89. City of Binghamton Areas within Walking Distance of Medical Facilities




E 90. City of Binghamton Areas within Walking Distance of Parks and Recreation Facilities
