



Message from the Director

2020 has been an unprecedented year for public health. We began the year as we always do with our core public health functions – inspecting restaurants and hotels, sampling water, running STD, TB and Immunization clinics, helping moms and young children through Early Intervention, WIC and home visiting programs as well as working on our many chronic disease prevention grants.



By mid-March we knew this year would be like no other as we watched COVID-19 spread through other parts of the world, through New York and eventually here to Broome County. The pandemic had us working in roles we never had before, taking staff out of their current Health Department positions and training them in communicable disease control with case investigation and contact tracing. We set up a data team and collected as much information as we could to report back to the community. We collaborated and partnered with other county departments, municipalities, schools and healthcare providers.

We came together and showed how the power of partnerships allowed us to pool resources and fight COVID-19. The largest lesson I learned in 2020 is that the Broome County Health Department staff will truly step up and do anything it takes to protect our community. I can truly say through the endless hours of work, this staff continues to amaze me with their commitment to keeping our community safe. Through testing, tracing and eventually vaccinating COVID-19 will no longer be the focus of our work but we will take the lessons learned from 2020 and will be better public health professionals for them.

Serving Our Community During a Pandemic

As we all know, 2020 has been a year like no other. While the majority of our efforts were directed to COVID-19 activities, we still managed to protect and promote our community's health in various ways. Here are just a few ways we served the community this year!

2020 Highlights

- Received designation as a Red Cross Heart Association Site.
- In partnership with the Broome County Adult Immunization Coalition, promoted the flu vaccine through use of billboards and radio media.
- Our Traffic Safety Program worked with the City of Binghamton Parks and Recreation Director to obtain head measurements of all participants and provided each child with a new bike helmet as well as educational information about proper helmet fitting, NYS laws and how to be a safe biker.
- Tobacco Free Broome and Tioga assisted in passing multiple policies this year including: Tobacco Retail Environment Policy in the Village of Endicott, Smoke Free Public Housing Policies, and Tobacco Free Parks policy in the Village of Candor.
- Participated in Vaping 101 Parent's Night at local school district.
- Shifted from our regular public health roles into COVID-19 case investigators and contact tracers which meant a lot of juggling and prioritization!

8,337 total COVID-19 cases

54% of cases were female   **46%** male

18-24 year-olds represented 17% of all cases

37% of deaths were among 80-89 year-olds
yet they accounted for only **5%** cases

COVID-19 Testing

Access to COVID-19 testing has been a key factor in controlling the spread of the virus. Identifying infectious individuals and requiring all close contacts to quarantine is our key defense.

In early September a cluster of cases was identified in a small geographical area. To stop the spread, mass testing was needed. Thus, the Mobile Testing Site was born. In partnership with Broome County Transit, Emergency Services and New York State Department of Health we organized a testing site capable of serving several hundred people a week.

Broome County Mobile Testing Site has
conducted **10,002** tests!

In the Field During a Pandemic

It is not uncommon for us to be out in the community doing various field work. Most days are filled with site visits including restaurant inspections, water supply monitoring, lead remediation and more.

Never did we imagine how a pandemic would transform how we would protect the health of the community. Instead of ensuring food safety we insured food security of those in quarantine. Plus, we:


- Checked on the well-being of community members sick with COVID-19
- Picked-up medications
- Delivered thermometers
- Made sure our homeless had a place to quarantine and more!

We took precautions to protect our health but above all we worked to protect the health of the community by helping people during their isolation and quarantine times.

Our Women, Infants and Children (WIC) program provides various services to support the health of our participants. Increasing access to nutritious


foods, education about a healthy diet, breastfeeding support and linking women to needed services are just some of the ways we promote the health of the community.

When the pandemic started, we had to quickly identify how we can safely deliver services to our families. We did this by:

- Providing all WIC services over the phone
- At least twice a month, conducted infant feeding classes via Zoom
- Providing phone appointments that are convenient to the participant-early morning, evening and Saturday appointments
- Providing drive up services to obtain WIC cards, breast pumps and supplies

Serving Our Children with Special Health Care Needs During a Pandemic

2020 has been a year to shine for our staff! Not only have they adapted to providing services in a new way but they have also been assisting with the COVID-19 response by doing contact calls, case investigations, and more!



To meet the special health care needs of our families during a pandemic, we had to explore new ways to stay connected in a safe but also effective way.

To do this:

- Our Early Intervention Service Coordinators conduct family meetings via phone or video call
- Our Preschool Special Education Program Coordinator attends school meetings via phone or video call
- Staff has adapted to a hybrid schedule of working remotely from home and in-person at the office
- Some service providers are working with families through teletherapy


