Introduction

The Adolescent Tobacco Use Prevention Act (ATUPA) is found under Article 13-F of the NYS Public Health Law, which was enacted to regulate the sale of tobacco and/or vapor products to minors. The Broome County Health Department routinely visit businesses that sell tobacco and/or vapor products to determine if they are in compliance with the law. The BCHD takes enforcement actions against the operator of the business where violations of Article 13-F are documented.

The New York State Tobacco Enforcement Program allows grantees to partner with law enforcement agencies to support objectives and tasks outlined in the ATUPA contract workplan. This agreement will begin on January 15, 2026, until January 15, 2028, renewal will be biannual.

Definitions

Adolescent Tobacco Use Prevention Act (ATUPA) - a NYS program that regulates the sale of tobacco and vaping products, to restrict their access by youth and young adults.

Article 13-F – the NYS Public Health Law enforced under ATUPA.

Flavored Vapor Product – a vapor product, or e-cigarette, that contains a natural form of nicotine, AND a flavor that has a distinguishable taste, or aroma, other than that of tobacco. These products are illegal in NYS.

Department of Taxation and Finance (DTF) – jurisdiction that is responsible for suspending or revoking a retailer's license to sell tobacco or vapor products after receiving violations of Article 13-F. They are also responsible for enforcing violations of Tax Law, Article 28-C, and Tax Law, Article 20-A at retailers.

This MOU is necessary and has been created to address:

Item 1: Unsafe conditions at select retailers, leading to non-compliance, the inability to inspect some retailers, and the inability to deliver some enforcement documents.

Item 2: The inability to access all parts of retail stores for inspection, specifically at retailers where safety is a concern, illicit products have been observed in hidden locations, storage, or in back rooms.

Item 3: The inability to follow up with complaint investigations at retailers that pose as safety concerns for staff.

Item 4: The inability to seize illicit FVPs due to safety concerns.

Item 5: The lack of proper storage and disposal capacity when evidence is collected from seizing illicit vapor and/or tobacco products.

Item 6: The rate of illicit tobacco and vapor products being distributed in our community.

Roles and Responsibilities

Broome County Sheriff's Department (BCSD)

- ❖ Assist ATUPA staff with inspections, re-inspections, and/or complaint investigations at facilities that are deemed unsafe or have a history of non-compliance.
- ❖ Appoint a contact person to communicate with the BCHD staff.
- ❖ Documenting violations with photo evidence when available.
- ❖ Assist with hand delivery of enforcement documents at facilities that are deemed unsafe.
- ❖ Seize illicit vapor and/or tobacco products.
- ❖ Document seized evidence and provide ATUPA staff with a copy of the documentation or chain of custody.
- ❖ Properly store and dispose of seized vapor and/or tobacco products.
- ❖ Testify in Hearings if necessary.

Broome County Health Department (BCHD)

- ❖ Provide the BCSD with pertinent information regarding retailers or violations, updated state memos, and/or guidance regarding the ATUPA workplan, and/or Article 13-F.
- ❖ Provide the BCSD with information regarding retailer violations, registration suspensions or revocations by the DTF, complaint investigations, and/or criminal investigation referrals made by the DTF and/or Office of Cannabis Management.
- ❖ Will contact the BCSD when their assistance is needed for an inspection, re-inspection, complaint investigation, field visit, and/or hand delivery of enforcement documents. At least 24 hours' notice is recommended.
- ❖ ATUPA staff are responsible for processing and implementing monetary penalties for well documented violations that are observed by law enforcement during their independent investigations, in which ATUPA staff are not present for.
- ❖ Keep updated records on retailer violations and history of compliance.
- ❖ Submitting suspension and/or revocation requests to the DTF.
