RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING RENEWAL OF THE AGREEMENT WITH SOUTHERN TIER INDEPENDENCE CENTER TO ACT AS FISCAL INTERMEDIARY FOR CONSUMER DIRECTED SERVICES FOR THE OFFICE FOR AGING'S EXPANDED IN-HOME SERVICES FOR THE ELDERLY PROGRAM (EISEP), UNMET NEED PROGRAM, TITLE III-E FAMILY CAREGIVER PROGRAM FOR 2025-2026

WHEREAS, this County Legislature, by Resolution 48 of 2023, and By Resolution 56 of 2024, authorized renewal of the agreement with Southern Tier Independence Center to act as fiscal intermediary for consumer directed services for the Office for Aging's Expanded In-home Services for the Elderly Program (EISEP), Unmet Need Program, Title III-E Family Caregiver Program, at the Medicaid rate of \$23.60 per hour, for the period April 1, 2024 through March 31, 2025, and

WHEREAS, said agreement is necessary to operate a Consumer Directed Personal Assistance Program that allows eligible consumers to hire, train, supervise and dismiss if necessary, their own Personal Assistants, and

WHEREAS, said agreement expires by its terms on March 31, 2025 and it is desired at this time to renew said agreement on substantially similar terms and conditions, at the rates in Exhibit "A" for the period April 1, 2025 through March 31, 2026, which will be replaced by the new Medicaid rate when approved, retroactive to April 1, 2025, now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that this County Legislature hereby authorizes renewal of the agreement with Southern Tier Independence Center, 135 East Frederick Street, Binghamton, New York 13904 to act as fiscal intermediary for consumer directed services for the Office for Aging's Expanded Inhome Services for the Elderly Program (EISEP), Unmet Need Program, Title III-E Family Caregiver Program, for the period April 1, 2025 through March 31, 2026, and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, that in consideration of said services, the County shall pay the Contractor at the rates in Exhibit "A" which will be replaced by the new Medicaid rate when approved retroactive to April 1, 2025 for the Office for Aging's Expanded In-home Services for the Elderly Program (EISEP), Unmet Need Program, Title III-E Family Caregiver Program, for the term of the agreement, and be it
