WHEREAS, it is desired at this time to amend the Tuition Reimbursement Program section of the Personnel Policy and Procedure Manual, now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that this County Legislature does hereby authorize and approve amending the Personnel Policy and Procedure Manual Tuition Reimbursement Program section to read as follows:

BROOME COUNTY TUITION REIMBURSEMENT PROGRAM

Program Purpose and Description:

The Tuition Reimbursement Program was established for benefit eligible employees based on the belief that continuing education to improve on-the-job performance or to contribute towards an employee's career development is both productive and desirable. It is expected that not only will this Tuition Reimbursement Program encourage career development, but it will promote employee retention and advancement within the County workforce.

Tuition Reimbursement Program Eligibility Requirements:

- Applicants must be full-time employees who have completed at least one (1) year of continuous and satisfactory full-time service with Broome County by the time the course begins. a) Part-time employees who have completed at least one (1) year of continuous and satisfactory part-time service with Broome County by the time the course begins are eligible for 50% of the full-time benefit.
- Any employee who leaves Broome County service prior to completing a course shall not receive reimbursement for that course even if reimbursement has been previously approved.
- 3) An employee who has received tuition reimbursement, who does not maintain employment with Broome County for a period of two (2) years subsequent to receiving tuition reimbursement, shall reimburse Broome County in full for such tuition reimbursement. This amount will be deducted from the employee's final paycheck.
- 4) Employees reimbursed under a collective bargaining agreement are not eligible for reimbursement under this program.
- 5) Department mandated training is not eligible for reimbursement under this program.

Qualifying Courses:

- Broome County employees will be eligible for reimbursement after successful completion of a course of study in any accredited educational institution, vocational or technical program, and/or professional development training.
- 2) The course of study must be job related or taken in preparation for career advancement within Broome County. Courses not job related but required as part of a core curriculum will also be eligible for reimbursement subject to approval.
- 3) The Personnel Department must review the course of study for which reimbursement is sought to determine that such course of study is job related or being taken in preparation for career advancement within Broome County. The department may publish pre-approved professional development courses.
- 4) All coursework must be endorsed by the employee's Department Head and the Personnel Officer or designee prior to reimbursement and should be done prior to registration and/or the beginning of the coursework.

2 Reimbursement Guidelines

- 1) Qualifying employees shall be eligible to receive reimbursement of tuition or course costs only. There will be no reimbursement for related expenses such as fees, books, travel etc.
- 2) The maximum allowable tuition reimbursement is equivalent to nine (9) credit hours per calendar year. The per credit hour rate shall be equal to the rate published by the State University of New York for New York State residents in an undergraduate program in their "Tuition Schedule.
- 3) The employee must submit a receipt for payment showing the date of payment, course title and cost along with a copy of the Tuition Reimbursement Request Form approving the course(s) for which the employee is seeking reimbursement.
- 4) Broome County will reimburse the employee who has successfully completed such approved coursework after receipt of the following: A copy of an official transcript or satisfactory grade report reflecting a grade of C or better; unless the course is ungraded or graded on a pass/ fail basis, then a passing or satisfactory grade is required. For ungraded professional development, a certificate of completion is required. Paid receipts for the course must be submitted as described earlier. Requests for payment of tuition reimbursement must be submitted to the Personnel Department as soon as possible after course completion but no later than two (2) months following course completion.
- 5) No reimbursement under this Program shall be permitted unless the course of study for which reimbursement is sought has been approved prior to the start of the course and determined that such course of study is job related or being taken in preparation for career advancement within Broome County.
- 6) The maximum amount of tuition reimbursement per year will be subject to budgetary limits.

Application Procedures

- 1) All requests for tuition reimbursement must be submitted on forms provided by the Personnel Department. Forward completed forms with attached course description(s) and costs to the Personnel Department.
- 2) The Personnel Department shall adopt and publish a tuition reimbursement schedule.
- 3) Applications must be received by the published deadlines. Applications will not be considered retroactively if they are received late.
- 4) Requests for reimbursement of all other job related vocational courses/ non-credit courses or professional development will be considered separately and may be submitted throughout the year.
- 5) If, after reimbursement is approved, an employee withdraws from the course or the course is otherwise canceled, the employee must notify the Personnel Department immediately so that funding can be reapportioned.

Description of Legislative Action

The purpose of the Agricultural District program is to encourage the continued use of farmland for agricultural production. The program is based on a combination of landowner incentives and protections which are designed to forestall the conversion of farmland to non-agricultural uses. According to the County's tax parcel records there are currently 6,006 parcels covering approximately 154,181 acres within Broome County Agricultural District 5.

Section 303-B of Article 25-AA of the New York State Agriculture and Markets Law authorizes the amendment of local Agricultural Districts following an application by the landowner and review and approval by the Broome County Legislature.

As part of the annual enrollment process, the Broome County Agriculture and Farmland Protection Board reviewed applications made by local landowners for inclusion into an Agricultural District. The Broome County Agricultural and Farmland Protection Board recommends the Broome County Legislature add eleven (11) parcels totaling 285 acres into Broome County Agricultural District 5. Each of the parcels represent lands that support agricultural farmland. The list of the parcels recommended for inclusion is as follows:

WHEREAS, the Director of Emergency Services requests authorization for a Memorandum of Understanding between New York State Division of Homeland Security and Emergency Services and Broome County Office of Emergency Services at no cost to Broome County, and

WHEREAS, agreement is necessary for Broome County Office of Emergency Services to take possession of flood mitigation equipment from New York State Division of Homeland Security and Emergency Services tol be used for emergency flood events, enhancing preparedness and response capabilities, now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that this County Legislature hereby authorizes an agreement for a Memorandum of Understanding with between New York State Division of Homeland Security and Emergency Services and Broome County Office of Emergency Services, attached as Exhibit "A", and be it

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING Between the NEW YORK-STATE DIVISION OF HOMELAND SECURITY AND EMERGENCY SERVICES And BROOME COUNTY

This Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) is between the New York State Division of Homeland Security and Emergency Services (DHSES) and Broome County. The aforementioned entities are collectively referred to as the "Parties."

WHEREAS, DHSES has been appropriated funds in the FY24 budget to purchase flood mitigation equipment to support counties in emergency flood events, enhancing preparedness and response capabilities.

WHEREAS, Broome County seeks to enhance its flood mitigation efforts through the use of state-provided equipment, helping protect vulnerable areas and mitigate disaster impacts.

WHEREAS, The purpose of this MOU is to establish the terms and conditions under which DHSES will transfer possession (but not ownership) of flood mitigation equipment to Broome County, while retaining oversight to ensure compliance and operational readiness.

NOW THEREFORE, in furtherance of the above objectives, the Parties mutually agree to the following terms:

- 1. DHSES will transfer possession of flood mitigation equipment to Broome County, with DHSES retaining ownership.
- 2. The equipment will be shipped directly to Broome County. DHSES will provide a recording spreadsheet to Broome County. Upon receipt of the equipment, Broome County will confirm and provide DHSES with a detailed inventory, including serial numbers, within 30 days. If this confirmation is not received within the timeframe, DHSES will contact Broome County to conduct an on-site inventory of equipment received. Once completed, the inventory will be attached to and made a part of this MOU.
- 3. This equipment is provided as a one-time allocation, DHSES will not replace equipment that becomes inoperable or reaches the end of its useful life. Broome County will notify DHSES if it no longer needs the equipment, it is no longer usable, or if it wishes to withdraw from this program.

- 4. DHSES will apply State branding stickers to the equipment after it has been inventoried to ensure easy identification and to distinguish it from county-owned equipment. Equipment use is not dependent on branding.
- 5. Upon request, DHSES will provide equipment use training. Broome County is responsible for ensuring its employees are trained and equipped to operate and maintain the equipment safely and effectively.
- 6. Broome County agrees to provide routine maintenance of this equipment as part of the county's existing maintenance schedule. This maintenance should follow the manufacturer's guidelines or standard practices for similar county-owned equipment. If equipment needs maintenance beyond the regular routine capabilities, Broome County may contact DHSES for additional guidance.
- 7. DHSES reserves the right to conduct routine inspections to assess equipment usage, condition, and maintenance compliance. Equipment should be kept in operational condition. DHSES may reclaim or reallocate equipment if it is not maintained or used appropriately.
- 8. In an emergency, DHSES may redeploy the equipment to neighboring counties if it is the most accessible option. Broome County may also deploy the equipment to neighboring counties in urgent or emergency situations, with notification to DHSES.
- 9. Use of the equipment does not require a New York Responds (NYR) request. Broome County should use the equipment along with its own resources as a first line of defense in flood related emergencies before requesting additional resources from the State.
- 10. The equipment provided in this MOU is intended for use in preparation for or response to an emergency, or upon approval by DHSES, and not for private, commercial, or personal use.

General Terms:

- 1. This MOU may only be modified by the written agreement of the Parties, duly signed by their authorized representatives.
- 2. This MOU is not transferable except with written consent of the Parties.
- 3. This MOU takes effect at the time the last Party signs.

FURTHER RESOLVED, that the County Executive or his duly authorized representative (including the Director of Management and Budget and/or Comptroller) is hereby authorized to make any transfers of funds required within this grant budget provided that employee head count is not increased, the County's contribution is not increased, and the salary rate or salary total for a position is not changed.

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING A PILOT AGREEMENT WITH ABUNDANT SOLAR POWER, LLC AND CONSENTING TO THE AMOUNT AND ALLOCATION OF CERTAIN TAX PAYMENTS FOR SOLAR ENERGY SYSTEMS LOCATED AT 327 HARDIE ROAD IN THE TOWN OF CONKLIN

WHEREAS, Abundant Solar Power (Company) has submitted a Notice of Intent to The Town of Conklin, The County of Broome and the Susquehanna Valley Central School District (Taxing Jurisdictions) that it plans to build and operate a "Solar Energy System" as defined in New York Real Property Tax Law ("RPTL") Section 487(I)(b) with an expected nameplate capacity ("Capacity") of approximately five (5) Megawatts AC, as measured at the inverter with potential associated energy storage systems (herein the "Project") on a parcel of land located within the Town of Conklin at 327 Hardie Road, (Tax Map Nos. 178.01-1-29.11, .12, .2), (herein the "Land"), and

WHEREAS, pursuant to RPTL 487(9)(a), the Taxing Jurisdictions have indicated their respective intent to require a Payment in Lieu of Taxes ("PILOT") Agreement with the Company, under which the Company (or any successor owner of the Project) will be required to make annual payments to the Taxing Jurisdictions for each year during the term of this Agreement; and for the purposes of this Agreement, the Project consists of all equipment, and infrastructure, but not the land directly utilized for the generation, conversion, storage, and transmission of solar energy, and

WHEREAS, the Taxing Jurisdictions have not opted out of RPTL Section 487 prior to the date a Notice of Interconnection with respect to the Project, and

WHEREAS, upon completion of the project, the Company will submit to the Assessor for the Town of Conklin, a RP-487 Application for Tax Exemption of Solar or Wind Energy Systems or Farm Waste Energy Systems with respect to the Project, demonstrating its eligibility for a real property tax exemption pursuant to RPTL Section 487, and

WHEREAS, the Parties intend that, during the term of this Agreement, the assessed value of the Land will remain on the taxable portion of the assessment roll with the value of the exemption with respect to the Project, computed pursuant to subdivision two of section 487 of the Real Property Tax Law and identified in a separate tax-exempt column of such tax rolls whereby the Company will be exempt from any statutory real property taxes for which it might otherwise be subjected under New York law with respect to the Project, now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, for and in consideration of the mutual covenants hereinafter contained, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged, the Parties hereby agree as follows:

1. <u>Representations of the Parties</u>.

(a) The Company hereby represents, warrants, and covenants that, as of the date of this Agreement:

i. The Company is duly organized, and a validly existing limited liability company duly authorized to do business in the State of New York, has requisite authority to conduct its business as presently conducted or proposed to be conducted under this Agreement, and has full legal right, power, and authority to execute, deliver, and perform all applicable terms and provisions of this Agreement.

ii. All necessary action has been taken to authorize the Company's execution, delivery, and performance of this Agreement and this Agreement constitutes the Company's legal, valid, and binding obligation enforceable against it in accordance with its terms.

None of the execution or delivery of this Agreement, the performance of the obligations in connection with the transactions contemplated hereby, or the fulfillment of the terms and conditions hereof will (i) conflict with or violate any provision of the Company's Certificate of Incorporation, Certificate of Formation, bylaws or other organizational documents or of any restriction or any agreement or instrument to which the Company is a party and by which it is bound; (ii) conflict with, violate, or result in a breach of any applicable law, rule, regulation, or order of any court or other taxing jurisdictions or authority of government or ordinance of the State or any political subdivision thereof; or (iii) conflict with, violate, or result in a breach of or constitute a default under or result in the imposition or creation of any mortgage, pledge, lien, security interest, or other encumbrance under this Agreement or under any term or condition of any mortgage, indenture, or any other agreement or instrument to which it is a party or by which it or any of the Company's properties or assets are bound.

iv. There is no action, suit, or proceeding, at law or in equity, or official investigation before or by any government authority pending or, to its knowledge, threatened against the Company, wherein an anticipated decision, ruling, or finding would result in a material adverse effect on the Company's ability to perform its obligations under this Agreement or on the validity or enforceability of this Agreement.

(b) The Taxing Jurisdictions hereby represent, warrant, and covenant that, as of the date of this Agreement:

- i. The Taxing Jurisdictions are each duly organized, validly existing, and in good standing under the laws of the State of New York and have full legal right, power, and authority to execute, deliver, and perform all applicable terms and provisions of this Agreement;
- ii. All necessary action has been taken to authorize the respective Taxing Jurisdictions' execution, delivery, and performance of this Agreement, and this Agreement constitutes a legal, valid, and binding obligation enforceable against it in accordance with its terms;
- iii. No governmental approval by or with any government authority is required for the valid execution, delivery, and performance under this Agreement by the Taxing Jurisdiction except such as has been duly or will be obtained or made; and
- iv. There is no action, suit, or proceeding, at law or in equity, or official investigation before or by any government authority pending or, to its knowledge, threatened against the Taxing Jurisdictions, wherein an anticipated decision, ruling, or finding would result in a material adverse effect on the Taxing Jurisdictions' ability to perform its obligations under this Agreement or on the validity or enforceability of this Agreement.

Tax Exemption; Payment in Lieu of Real Property Taxes.

(a) Tax-Exempt Status of the Project Facility. It is the intent of the Parties that, pursuant to RPTL 487, the Project shall be identified as exempt upon the assessment rolls of the Town of Conklin. A Real Property Tax Exemption Form (RP 487) has or will be filed by the Company with the Town Assessor. Upon acceptance by the Assessor, the Project shall be eligible for an exemption pursuant to RPTL Section 487, which shall render the Project Improvements eligible to be exempt from real property taxes otherwise payable to the Taxing Jurisdictions.

(b) Company agrees to make annual payments to the Taxing Jurisdictions in lieu of real property taxes for the Project for a period of fifteen (15) consecutive fiscal tax years (the "Term") in the amounts set forth in Exhibit A to this Agreement ("Annual Payments"), which collectively equate to \$2,500 per megawatt AC with a 2% annual escalator, as such amount may be adjusted according to Section 3 and Section 4, herein. Notwithstanding anything in this agreement to the contrary, no Annual Payment will exceed the amounts that would otherwise be payable to any Taxing Jurisdiction but for the RPTL 487 exemption. The Term shall begin with the first applicable tax year of the Town following the taxable status date (March 1 of such year) for which a Real Property Tax Exemption Form (RP-487) was filed with the assessor (the "Commencement Date"), and shall end with the first applical year following such fiscal year the exemption first became effective.

(c) The Company agrees that the payments in lieu of taxes under this Agreement will not be reduced on account of a depreciation factor or reduction in the Taxing Jurisdictions' tax rate, and the Taxing Jurisdictions agrees that the payments in lieu of taxes will not be increased on account of an inflation factor or increase in the Taxing Jurisdictions' tax rate, all of which factors have been considered in arriving at the payment amounts reflected in this Agreement.

3. <u>Change in Capacity at Mechanical Completion: Adjustments to Payments</u>. To the extent that the Capacity of the Project is more or less than the five (5) Megawatts AC on the date when the Project is mechanically complete and Company has commenced production of electricity, the Annual Payments will be increased or decreased on a pro rata basis.

4. <u>Change in Capacity After Mechanical Completion: Adjustments to Payments</u>. If after the Completion Date, but during the Term of this Agreement, the Capacity is increased or decreased as a result of the replacement or upgrade or partial removal or retirement of existing Project equipment or property or the addition of new Project equipment or property, the Annual Payments shall be increased or decreased on a pro rata basis for the remaining years of the Agreement.

5. <u>Payment Collection</u>.

The Company will be responsible for making Annual Payments to the Taxing Jurisdictions in accordance with this Section 5 and Exhibit A of this Agreement. The Company shall send payments to the Town and County on or before January 31 of each year and acknowledges that the issuance of bills by the Taxing Jurisdictions will be their option.

6. <u>Late Payment</u>. All Annual Payments are due to the Taxing Jurisdictions on or before such dates, as stated in Section 5 above. The Company acknowledges that the issuance of bills by the Taxing Jurisdictions will be their option. Annual Payments not made to the Taxing Jurisdictions when due each year shall be subject to the same interest and penalties as unpaid real property taxes.

7. <u>Transfer or Assignment</u>. Except as set forth in this Section 7, this Agreement may not be assigned or transferred by the Company without the prior written consent of the Taxing Jurisdictions and such consent may not be unreasonably withheld, conditioned, or delayed. The Company may, without the advance written consent of the Taxing Jurisdictions, assign its obligations under this Agreement to (A) an affiliate of the Company or (B) to an institutional lender providing financing to Company for the construction, operation and/or maintenance of the Project. If the Company is permitted to otherwise assign this Agreement with the advance written consent of the Taxing Jurisdictions, the Company shall be released from all obligations under this Agreement upon assumption thereof by the assignee, provided that the Company, as a condition of such assignment or transfer and to the reasonable satisfaction of the Taxing Jurisdictions, cure any defaults and satisfy all liabilities arising under this Agreement prior to the date of such assignment or transfer, and the assignee agrees in writing to accept all obligations of the Company. Any assignment or transfer in violation of this Agreement shall be null and void.

8. <u>Removal</u>. The Company shall secure financial security in a form and amount sufficient to the Town's satisfaction, determined in its sole discretion, to cover the expense of the removal of the Project at the conclusion of the Project's operations.

9. <u>Statement of Good Faith</u>. The Parties agree that the payment obligations established by this Agreement have been negotiated in good faith in recognition of and with due consideration of the full and fair taxable value of the Project.

WHEREAS, this County Legislature, by Resolution 208 of 2023 authorized and approved the Tobacco Control Program Grant for the Department of Health and adopted a program budget in the amount of \$325,000 for the period July 1, 2023 through June 30, 2024, and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution 208 of 2023, the Department of Health accepted and allocated additional funding in the amount of \$270,833 and extended the term of the grant for the purpose of expending grant funds, and

WHEREAS, said program is necessary to prevent the initiation of tobacco use, educate the public about tobacco industry marketing tactics, prevent exposure to second-hand smoke, and promote the New York State Smoker's Quitline, and

WHEREAS, it is desired to renew said program grant in the amount of \$360,000 for the period May 1, 2025 through April 30, 2026, now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that this County Legislature hereby authorizes and approves acceptance of \$360,000 from the New York State Department of Health, Corning Tower, Rockefeller Empire State Plaza, Albany, New York 12237 for the Department of Health's Tobacco Control Program Grant for the period May 1, 2025 through April 30, 2026, and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, that this County Legislature hereby approves and adopts the program budget annexed hereto as Exhibit "A" in the total amount of \$360,000, and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Department of Health is authorized to accept and allocate additional program funds for the period May 1, 2025 through April 30, 2026, provided there is no increase in employee head count, the County's financial contribution is not increased and the salary rate is not changed, and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, that the County Executive or his duly authorized representative is hereby empowered to execute any such agreements, documents, or papers, approved as to form by the Department of Law, as may be necessary to implement the intent and purpose of this Resolution, and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, that the County Executive or his duly authorized representative is hereby empowered (with the approval of the grantor agency) to reduce the time period of the grant provided there is no change in the grant budget or extend the terms of the grant agreement for the purpose of expending any unexpended grant funds, and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, that the County Executive or his duly authorized representative (including the Director of Management and Budget and/or Comptroller) is hereby authorized to make any transfers of funds required within this grant budget provided that employee head count is not increased, the County's contribution is not increased, and the salary rate or salary total for a position is not changed.
