#35 RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE WILLOW POINT REHABILITATION AND NURSING CENTER TO WRITE OFF UNCOLLECTIBLE ACCOUNTS FOR 2017-2020 Deputy County Executive Michael Ponticiello reported on Venesky & Company's independent review of Willow Point Rehabilitation & Nursing Center finances. (Attached with the minutes) Responding to a question from Mr. Whalen, Mr. Ponticiello and Mr. Knebel stated that an annual write off of bad debt at the Nursing Home was an unwritten policy and it lapsed during staff transitions and the Coronavirus pandemic. Mr. Arnov spoke on Medicaid and Medicare managed care companies denying claims that are sometimes easily rectifiable but have become a tedious process to resubmit with some billing platforms being problematic. Responding to a

question from Mr. Flagg, Mr. Knebel stated that the industry standard for bad debt write off is around 1%, and WPRNC is closer to 8%. Responding to a question from Mrs. O'Brien, Mr. Ponticiello stated that it was his understanding that most of the recommendations in the 2015 audit report from Bonadio were not implemented. Mr. Ponticiello explained that the current agreement with Centers for Care has addressed the concern that the system did not support the billing systems and did not cross reference medical information and that the Centers system is being used and is directly integrated with medical records. Responding to questions from Mrs. O'Brien about staff, vacant positions and training, Mr. Garnar stated that over the past five or six years the County has provided everything that the nursing home has asked for in their budgets and that the contract with Centers should address the concerns about proper system input, billing and collections. Mr. Garnar further stated that the Bonadio report stated that a culture change was needed at the nursing home and that is just what Centers contract is intended to do. Mrs. O'Brien and Mr. Flagg stated they would like to have a follow presentation in the next few months to see how things at the nursing home are going. Mr. Ponticiello stated that although Centers is managing collections, any money collected goes to the County.

Mr. Baker made a motion, seconded by Mr. Wildoner to amend the title to "...2017-2021" Amendment carried. Ayes-5, Nays-0
