State of Emergency


- State of Emergency was formally declared by the County Executive on March 14, 2020 due to COVID-19.
- Currently 7 active Emergency Orders

Emergency Operations Center

- •EOC was formally opened on March 12, 2020
- •We are currently at a Level 3 Activation (Full activation)
- •EOC is working 13 objectives
- •First time we have had to virtualize large portions of the EOC
- Over 600 "tickets" entered into DisasterLAN
 - 450 requests
 - 400 completed state













- •Distributed over 390,000 pieces of PPE




Case investigation team speaking with all people with positive test results for COVID-19

Testing

- Testing has recently been expanded to include moderately ill patients with COVID-19 symptoms
- Both UHS and Lourdes using virtual visits and making appointments for patients to be swabbed
- We have seen a large increase in the number tested over the last week
