The Personnel Committee meeting was called to order by the Chair at 4:02 PM. Mr. Weslar made a motion to move the agenda, seconded by Mr. Hilderbrant

The Committee took the following action with regard to the matters before it:

#11 RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING A PERSONNEL CHANGE REQUEST FOR THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS - BUILDINGS AND GROUNDS

Responding to a question from Mr. Weslar, Ms. Bolton stated that a number of years ago the previous Commissioner of Public Works moved the construction crew from the Parks Department budget into the DPW-Buildings & Grounds Division budget. The title of the manager position for this crew should probably have been changed at that time because it was no longer a Parks Operations Manager and has not been since that switch. Because the person who has historically held this position was moving into a new position – it seemed like a good time to update the position description and revise the position title to better reflect what this position does. The title change was discussed with the Union – with the understanding that it would remain at the same Union grade and salary. This construction crew still does work at the parks, as well as at other sites and facilities, but is not a part of the Parks staff. Parks Operation Manager does not reflect what this person does. It was also noted that an email was sent out prior to this committee meeting with the same information.

#12 RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING A HOME RULE REQUEST TO AUTHORIZE THE COUNTY OF BROOME TO OFFER AN OPTIONAL TWENTY YEAR RETIREMENT PLAN TO JOSHUA QUINN, A DEPUTY SHERIFF EMPLOYED BY SUCH COUNTY

Responding to a question from Ms. Myers, Mr. Dellapenna stated that during an audit it was discovered that Deputy Quinn was in the wrong retirement plan. Deputy Quinn was a former Corrections Officer. When he moved to a Road Patrol Deputy, the retirement plan didn't switch over. It was found that all of the necessary paperwork was filled out and sent to the State but didn't go through for some reason. This resolution puts Deputy Quinn in the correct retirement plan.
