WHEREAS, the County Executive's salary was last adjusted in 2012 when it was reduced by 5%, and

WHEREAS, it is the desire of this County Legislature to adjust the County Executive's salary and create parity with certain other countywide positions that are annually adjusted in line with the Consumer Price Index, now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that Local Law Intro. No. 6 of 2022, entitled: "A Local Law Increasing the Salary of the County Executive for 2023" be and the same hereby is adopted and approved in accordance with the Broome County Charter and Code and all the applicable statutes and laws pertaining thereto.

LOCAL LAW INTRO. NO. 6 Of 2022

A LOCAL LAW INCREASING THE SALARY OF THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE FOR 2023

BE IT ENACTED by the County Legislature of the County of Broome, New York as follows:

Section 1. That commencing January 1, 2023 the annual salary of the County Executive shall be \$108,095.

Section 2. Section 2 of Local Law No.4 of 1999 is amended as follows:

For years commencing on January 1, 2023, and annually thereafter, the salaries of the **Broome County Executive**, Broome County Sheriff, and Broome County Clerk shall be increased by the percentage of increase, if any, of the CPI (Urban Wage Earners, U.S. City Average, Northeast Urban-Cities 50,000-500,000 or equivalent) during the year immediately preceding with an annual cap not to exceed 5%.

Section 3. This Local Law shall take effect forty-five (45) days after adoption, or upon approval by a majority of the qualified local electors in the event a permissive referendum is held in accordance with the Municipal Home Rule Law.
