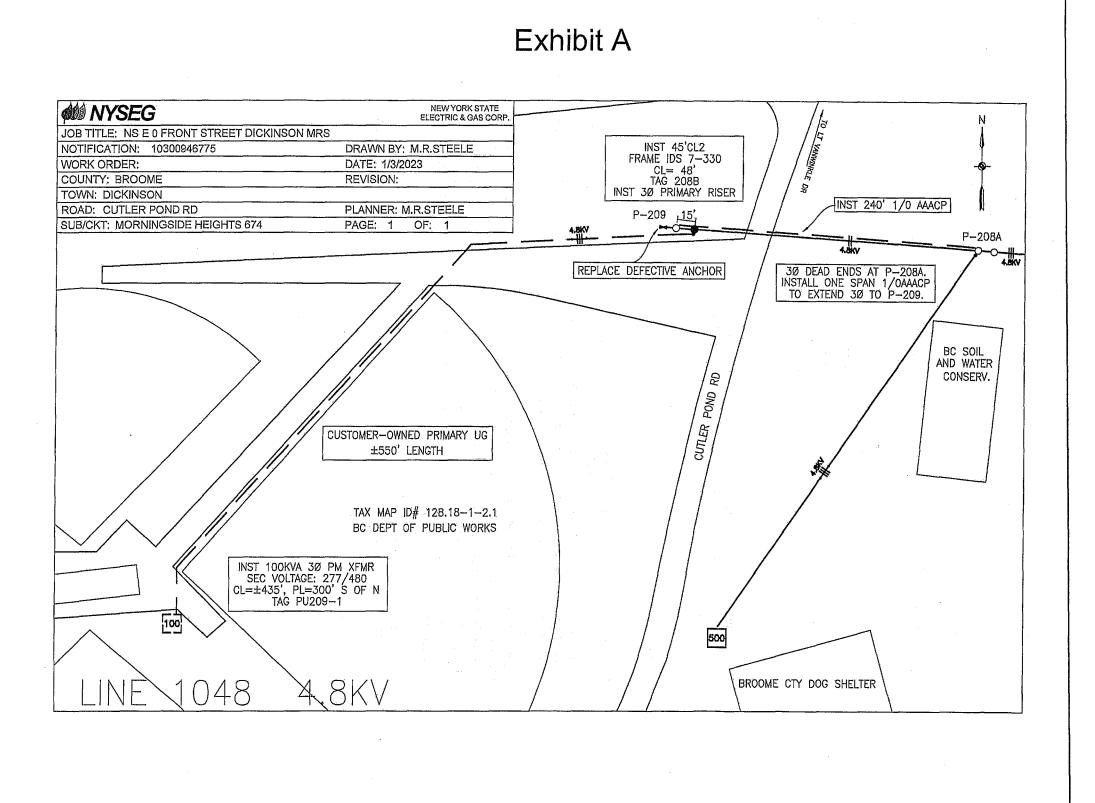

#### **Description of Legislative Action**

Section 303-B of Article 25-AA of the New York State Agriculture and Markets Law authorizes the amendment of local Agricultural Districts following an application by the landowner and review and approval by the Broome County Legislature.

The purpose of the Agricultural District program is to encourage the continued use of farmland for agricultural production. The program is based on a combination of landowner incentives and protections which are designed to forestall the conversion of farmland to non-agricultural uses.

As part of the annual enrollment process, the Broome County Agriculture and Farmland Protection Board reviewed applications made by local landowners for inclusion into an Agricultural District. The Broome County Agricultural and Farmland Protection Board recommends the Broome County Legislature add fourteen (14) parcels totaling 828.94 acres into Broome County Consolidated Agricultural District 5. Each of the parcels represent agricultural farmland. The list of the parcels recommended for inclusion is as follows:

WHEREAS, under the Affordable Care Act (ACA), the federal government provided an enhanced federal Medical matching share (eFMAP) to a handful of states, including New York, that had already provided Medicaid coverage for the "newly eligible populations" in the ACA, which was intended to reduce the number of uninsured people, and

WHEREAS, the New York State Congressional delegation intended that these additional funds be shared by the state with counties, based on their proportionate share of the nonfederal Medicaid costs, and

WHEREAS, starting in State Fiscal Year (SFY) 2014, the State of New York began sharing these federal ACA savings directly with counties and the savings for a year were provided by lowering the weekly payments each county and New York City (NYC) make to the State to support the State's Medicaid program; and through February 1, 2023, the State continues to share the federal savings from the ACA eFMAP with the 57 counties and NYC, and

WHEREAS, the SFY 2024 State Budget proposed by Governor Kathy Hochul would end the ACA enhanced Federal Medical Assistance Percentage (eFMAP) federal pass-thru to counties and NYC, and

WHEREAS, Governor Hochul's proposed budget would keep all of the enhanced federal Medical funding going forward, and use it to cover further expansions of Medicaid eligibility and benefits and to increase payments to health care providers, and

WHEREAS, the elimination of the ACA eFMAP federal pass-thru will require the 57 counties to spend at least \$280 million more in SFY 2024, and approximately \$1 billion when New York City is included, and

WHEREAS, Governor Hochul's proposed elimination of the ACA eFMAP federal passthrough will result in an increase of about \$5 million in Broome County's annual Medicaid costs during New York State's fiscal year 2024 alone which would likely have a significant impact on County taxpayers and/or services that the County provides to its residents, and

WHEREAS, Medicaid is the largest single state mandate imposed on county and New York City taxpayers and is a major contributor to New York's high local tax burden compared to other states, and

WHEREAS, Broome County understands that Congress intended these federal funds to be shared with counties proportional to the amount they contributed toward the nonfederal Medicaid match, and

WHEREAS, the eFMAP funds are not state general fund dollars, and
