Mr. Ponticiello briefed the committee on the reason for this resolution. It goes back to a discussion from early this year that the advertising budget for the Airport was too low at around \$50,000 and should be increased to attract more flights.

There was an amendment proposed by the Administration and the Commissioner of Aviation to decrease the total agreement increase from \$200,000 to \$120,000 with half of the additional amount coming from the Broome County Industrial Development Agency. This will need to be reflected in the resolution.

Mr. Baker made a motion, seconded by Mr. Hilderbrant to decrease the total amount from \$200,000 to \$120,000 with \$60,000 coming from the Broome County Industrial Development Agency and create the budget revenue line 28010005.5000531.2010.
