So uh Broome Community College is a sinking ship. It is going to end up like a lot of other colleges in New York state and Pennsylvania. And there are tells, there's tells, and it's interesting that I attend the Broome County Board of Trustees meeting and I think it is very poor scheduling that this public hearing is scheduled at the very hour and day that the Board of Trustees are meeting, and a lot of employees attend those meeting, so it looks like they chose not to be here. But whether its Davis College, College of Saint Rose, Cazenovia College, there's a tell and the tell is financial shenanigans. Borrowing against assets that took maybe 50, 60, 80, 100 years. Borrowing against those assets to meet current expenditures, and Broome Community College is doing the same thing. They went out to look for a credit rating to sell the dorms. Those dorms should be paid off by now, instead they want to borrow against them just to keep afloat. Tell, tell, 100%. Uh the culinary school remember that it's a \$25 million obligation on your books, on your books, that was a finagled deal that the IDA wanted to get land and then they wanted to get rid of the library so it ended up as a culinary center and one of the hallmarks of the culinary center was that the students would earn while they learned, they would be staffed there, they would learn the trade of the culinary arts. Guess what its privatized. There's no students working there. il's a private company. It was a 100% total dishonest lie. So can we trust liars. Now the

interesting thing about" Mr. Reynolds: "Ten seconds John." John Solak "Ten seconds? Okay ten seconds goodbye Dan always nice being here. Mr. Reynolds: "Thank you Mr. Solak". Mr. Reynolds asked if there were any other speakers, seeing none he closed the public hearing at 5:11 p.m.

Ms. Ryan wished everyone a happy first day of summer and thanked the Administration for providing cooling centers.

Mr. Weslar stated that the Binghamton TOP Club - Unity in the Community would be at Recreation Park to address food insecurity and provide outreach.

Mr. Reynolds reminded everyone that the County airshow will be on July  $6^{th}$  and  $7^{th}$  and encouraged everyone to attend.
