#### Disregard all outstanding County and Union Proposals not mentioned herein.

#### Amend Article 9 ("Seniority"), Section 2.1 as follows:

Every new employee who is hired to fill a position on a permanent basis shall be subject to a probationary period of not more than twenty-sixfifty-two (5226), weeks unless a longer period is permitted by the Civil Service Law, in addition to any mandatory training period. Upon the satisfactory completion of the probationary period, such employees shall be notified in writing of such successful completion, and they shall be entered on the seniority list retroactive to their initial date of hire.

#### Amend Article 10 ("Work Force Changes"), Section 1.6 as follows:

The assignment of the Field Intelligence Officer, Training Sgt., Administrative Sgt., Programs Sgt. and I.D. Officer shall be at the complete discretion of the Sheriff.

#### Amend Article 11 ("Work Hours and Schedules"), Section 3.5 as follows:

Any shift vacancies which occur during the first 30 calendar days of a bid period shall be bid once at the end of the above referenced 30 days. That one time bid shall be by seniority as defined in Article 9.1.1.

Any vacancy that occurs 31 days after the bid period shall not be bid until the next regular bidding period.

The term "bid period" shall mean the four (4) months that are worked (ex. January through April). The term "bidding period" shall mean the time frame when officers are selecting their post.

#### Amend Article 13 ("Salaries, Wages and other Emoluments"), Section 4.1 as follows:

#### 13.4.1

Each employee hired after the ratification of this contract shall receive in addition to his/her base rate of pay, longevity service pay as follows:

Years of Continuous Service	Amount
12-16 years	\$1200
17-21 years	\$1600
22 + years	\$1850

#### Amend Article 15 ("Pensions"), Section 1.1 as follows:

The Public Employer agrees to provide coverage for all employees employed prior to July 1, 1976 covered by this Agreement who are eligible under the New York State Retirement System Plan 89-a. All civilian employees not eligible for coverage shall be covered under 75(i). The cost of such coverage shall be borne in its entirety by the Public Employer. In addition, the Public Employer further agrees to provide the benefits of the accumulated sick leave conversion provision (Section 41j) at no cost to the employee

#### Amend Article 17 ("Hospitalization and Medical Benefits"), Section 1.1 as follows:

The Public Employer agrees to continue and maintain a health insurance program equivalent to that provided on December 31, 2006. The Public Employer shall pay eighty-five (85%) percent of the premium cost for employee and dependent coverage. A summary of coverage shall be made available to each employee in handbook form.

All Employees eligible for health insurance coverage hired subsequent to final ratification by both parties of the 2011-2014 contract will be eligible for medical insurance coverage in the Broome County RMSCO Advantage Plan only on the first month following one month of employment. These employees electing to enroll in this Plan will be offered an opportunity to switch into another health plan offering, if desired, at the next open enrollment period following at least one year of enrollment in the Advantage Plan beginning January 1, 2012. Those employees electing coverage under the Advantage Plan will have the opportunity to switch back into another health plan offering at the next open enrollment period following at least one year of coverage under the Advantage Plan.

Employees hired after the ratification of this contract who elect health insurance will be signed up for the Advantage Plan. Those employees shall remain on the Advantage Plan until they have

reached three (3) years of service. Once they have reached three (3) years of service, those employees may elect a different health plan during the next open enrollment period if they choose to do so.

Insurance Eligible employees hired after final ratification of the 2011-2014 contract by both parties but before the final ratification of the 2015-2019 contract by both parties shall continue to pay 20% of the premium cost for employee and dependent coverage for the life of the contract. Insurance Eligible employees hired after final ratification of the 2015-2019 contract by both parties shall pay 22% of the premium cost for employee and dependent coverage for the life of the contract. Current eEmployees as of final ratification of the 2011-2014 hired before the ratification of the 2011-2014 contract will continue to pay 185% of the premium cost for employee and dependent coverage. Effective January 1, 20183, these employees will pay 16%; as of January 1, 2014, employees will continue to pay 16%. Effective December 31, 2014, these employees will pay 1948%; effective December 31, 2019 these employees will pay 20%

#### Amend Article 17 ("Hospitalization and Medical Benefits"), Section 1.3 as follows:

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING RENEWAL OF THE AGREEMENT WITH TIOGA COUNTY CORNELL COOPERATIVE EXTENSION FOR SERVICES RELATED TO THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH'S TOBACCO CONTROL PROGRAM GRANT FOR 2016-2017

WHEREAS, this County Legislature, by Resolution 250 of 2015, authorized renewal of the agreement with Tioga County Cornell Cooperative Extension at an amount not to exceed \$70,000, for services related to the Department of Health's Tobacco Control Program Grant for the period July 1, 2015 through June 30, 3016, and

WHEREAS, said services are necessary to prevent initiation of tobacco use, educate the public about tobacco industry marketing tactics, prevent exposure to second-hand smoke, prevent tobacco sponsorship in local non-profit venues, prevent tobacco promotions in local bars and restaurants, and promote the New York State Smoker's Quitline, and

WHEREAS, said agreement expires by its terms on June 30, 2016 and it is desired at this time to renew said agreement on substantially similar terms and conditions, for an amount not to exceed \$70,000 for the period July 1, 2016 through June 30, 2017, now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that this County Legislature hereby authorizes the renewal of the agreement with Tioga County Cornell Cooperative Extension, 56 Main Street, Owego, New York 13827, for services related to the Department of Health's Tobacco Control Program Grant for the period July 1, 2016 through June 30, 2017, and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, that in consideration of said services, the County shall pay the Contractor an amount not to exceed \$70,000 for the term of the agreement, and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, that the payments hereinabove authorized shall be made from budget line 25010004.6004146.1011.2510508 (Subcontracted Program Expense), and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, that the County Executive or her duly authorized representative is hereby empowered to execute any such agreements, documents, or papers, approved as to form by the Department of Law, as may be necessary to implement the intent and purpose of this Resolution.
