A. Ticketmaster and Principal entered into that certain Licensed User Agreement dated as of December 1, 2018 (the "Licensed User Agreement").

B. Ticketmaster and Principal hereby desire to amend the Licensed User Agreement in certain respects as set forth herein.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises and covenants set forth herein, the parties hereby agree, effective as of the Effective Date set forth above, as follows:

1. **Defined Term(s)**. All capitalized terms used and not otherwise defined herein shall have the meanings ascribed to them in the Licensed User Agreement. The following new definitions are hereby added to Section 16 of the Licensed User Agreement:

<u>AccountManager</u>: The Ticketmaster Software and hosting services that allow Subscribers to manage their accounts.

<u>Archtics</u>: The Ticketmaster Software that delivers extensive season, miniplan and single ticket functionality in connection with the Ticketmaster host system and distribution channels for inventory control by Ticketmaster and Principal.

<u>Hosted Platform</u>: The equipment, operating system, hardware and software specifications, and networking environment on and with which the Archtics Software is hosted by Ticketmaster, and additions or replacements to the foregoing which may be implemented by Ticketmaster in accordance with the terms of the Licensed User Agreement.

Interface Page: A co-branded web page interface for use with Products transactions, designed, created and maintained by Ticketmaster to have, in general, the look and feel of Principal's Website and hosted on Ticketmaster's web servers.

Subscriber: Any person who holds an account on Principal's AccountManager.

#### 2. License and Use of Archtics; Hosted Platform.

(a) <u>Principal's Website/Interface Page</u>. Subject to the completion of the installation of Archtics, Ticketmaster will develop the Interface Page that will enable Principal's Subscribers to access their account information and conduct "real-time" transactions by linking to the Interface Page from the Principal's Website. The Interface Page may contain a short, related textual description of AccountManager features and shall contain Ticketmaster's designated wording and graphic depiction thereof, currently "by Ticketmaster."

(b) <u>Archtics Support</u>. Ticketmaster shall provide maintenance and support for the Archtics Software in accordance with the terms set forth in Section 7 of the Licensed User Agreement. Ticketmaster will not be obligated to continue to provide maintenance with respect to any version of any particular Archtics Software product hosted by Principal for more than one year after a release by Ticketmaster of an upgraded version of the same Software.

(c) <u>Customization Services Provided at No Additional Cost</u>. With respect to initial implementation of the Ticketmaster Archtics Software, Ticketmaster shall also provide, at no additional cost to Principal, (i) on-site support from Ticketmaster's national or regional personnel, (ii) unique Ticketmaster Archtics customization (e.g., diagrams, invoices, other executables, etc.), (iii) custom reporting, and (iv) customized on-line assistance. (Services described in (ii) through (iv) are referred to herein as "Customization Services".) Generally two hours of Customization Services that far exceed this level of support will be billed to Principal.

(d) <u>Hosted Platform</u>. Ticketmaster shall host the Archtics Software and provide and maintain the Hosted Platform on which the Archtics Software will be installed and run, including provision of the physical environment including physical security, HVAC and power for the required server hardware for the Hosted Platform and the Archtics Software. RESOLVED, that Local Law Intro. No. 10 of 2019, entitled: "Emergency First Responders Protection Act of 2019", be and the same hereby is adopted and approved in accordance with the Broome County Charter and Administrative Code and all the applicable statutes and laws pertaining thereto.

#### LOCAL LAW INTRO. NO. 10 Of 2019

# A LOCAL LAW ENACTING THE "EMERGENCY FIRST RESPONDERS PROTECTION ACT OF 2019"

BE IT ENACTED by the County Legislature of the County of Broome, Chapter 315 is established as follows:

- Section 315-1. Title: This local law shall be known as the "Emergency First Responders Protection Act of 2019."
- Section 315-2. Legislative Findings: Emergency First Responders play a critical role in protecting people and property in the event of fires, natural and man-made disasters, medical emergencies, terrorist and other criminal acts, and numerous other types of emergencies. Emergency First Responders are deserving of appreciation and commendation for the invaluable services they provide to the residents of Broome County and New York State. The Legislature further finds and determines that it is critical to ensure that Emergency First Responders are protected from harassment and this Legislature must enact protections for those personnel while engaged in their important duties.
- Section 315-3. Definitions:

As used in this local law, the following terms shall have the meanings indicated:

"Emergency First Responder" - a law enforcement officer, firefighter, emergency medical services personnel, or auxiliary officer

"Law Enforcement Officer" - any active city or state law enforcement officer, peace officer, sheriff, deputy sheriff, probation or parole officer, marshal, deputy, wildlife enforcement agency, county or state correctional officer, fire marshal, or commissioned agent of the department of corrections and community supervision, as well as any federal law enforcement officer or employee, whose permanent duties include making arrests, performing search and seizures, execution of criminal arrest warrants, execution of civil seizure warrants, any civil functions performed by sheriffs or deputy sheriffs, enforcement of penal or traffic laws, or the care, custody, control, or supervision of inmates.

"Firefighter" - (i) any firefighter regularly employed by a fire department of any municipality of the state of New York and (ii) any volunteer firefighter as defined in subdivision one of section three of the New York State Volunteer Firefighters' Benefit Law.

"Emergency Medical Services Personnel" - the personnel of a service or agency, whether paid or volunteer, engaged in providing initial emergency medical assistance, including but not limited to emergency medical technicians, advanced emergency medical technicians, and paramedics.

"Auxiliary Officer" – A volunteer officer for a police, fire or first responder agency.

Section 315-4: Harassment of Emergency First Responders Prohibited: A person is guilty of harassing an Emergency First Responder when he or she intentionally engages in conduct against an Emergency First Responder that intends to annoy, alarm, or threaten the personal safety of the Emergency First Responder. This action must occur when such Emergency First Responder is in the course of performing his or her official duties and the person committing such act knows or reasonably should know that such person is an Emergency First Responder.

Section 315-5: Penalties: Violation of this law shall constitute an unclassified misdemeanor punishable by up to one year of imprisonment and/or a fine of up to \$5.000.

Section 316-6. Severability: If any clause, sentence, paragraph, subdivision, section, or part of this law or the application thereof to any person, individual, corporation, firm, partnership, entity, or circumstance shall be adjudged by any court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid or unconstitutional, such order or judgment shall not affect, impair, or invalidate the remainder thereof, but shall be confined in its operation to the clause, sentence, paragraph, subdivision, section, or part of this law, or in its application to the person, individual, corporation, firm, partnership, entity, or circumstance directly involved in the controversy in which such order or judgment shall be rendered.

Section 316-7. Effective Date: This local law shall take effect immediately upon final adoption and filing with the Secretary of State.

# RESOLUTION URGING THE ADOPTION OF SENATE BILL S.335 (AKSHAR) AND ASSEMBLY BILL A.5065 (ABBATE) A/K/A THE "COMMUNITY HEROES PROTECTION ACT"

WHEREAS, every day throughout Broome County, New York State, and across our nation, first responders, including law enforcement officers, firefighters, and emergency medical personnel, perform the critical role of protecting and ensuring safety of the public, and

WHEREAS, working or volunteering in these professions doesn't come without a cost to the brave men and women who risk their lives on a daily basis to keep our communities safe, and

WHEREAS, according to the National Law Enforcement Officers Memorial Fund, 158 law enforcement officers were killed across the United States in 2018 and year-to-date, there have been 97 killed in 2019, of which nine were from New York State, and

WHEREAS, of those 158 deaths in 2018, 53 were firearms related fatalities, a 15% percent increase from 2017, and of the 97 deaths in 2019, 39 were firearms related fatalities, and

WHEREAS, according to the National Association of Emergency Medical Technicians, 80% of EMTs have experienced some form of injury as a result of the job, with 52% having been injured by assault and over 20% stating that their primary concern is their personal safety, and

WHEREAS, there have been numerous high-profile attacks made against first responders all around the country in recent years and protecting the health and safety of all first responders is paramount to ensuring the safety of the public, and

WHEREAS, the "Community Heroes Protection Act", introduced by Senator Frederick J. Akshar II and Assemblyman Peter J. Abbate, Jr. would classify all offenses against first responders such as law enforcement officers, firefighters, and emergency services personnel as hate crimes if they are intentionally aimed at first responders based on the profile of their career, now, therefore be it

RESOLVED, that this County Legislature strongly supports and commends all law enforcement officers, firefighters, emergency medical personnel, and all other first responders for the invaluable services they provide, and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, that this County Legislature applauds the introduction by the New York State Senate of Senate Bill S.335 and the introduction of companion Assembly Bill A.5065 a/k/a the "Community Heroes Protection Act" and urges the New York State Senate and Assembly to adopt the legislation for it to then be signed into law by the New York State Governor, and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, the Clerk of the Legislature shall forward a copy of this Resolution to Governor Andrew M. Cuomo, Senate Majority Leader Andrea Stewart-Cousins, Assembly Speaker Carl E. Heastie, Senator Frederick J. Akshar II, Assemblyman Peter J. Abbate, Jr, Assemblyman Clifford W. Crouch, Assemblyman Christopher S. Friend, Assemblywoman Donna A. Lupardo, and the New York State Association of Counties.
