

SIU Press Release - Town of Lisle Man Faces Felony
Drug and Weapon Charges Following Search Warrant
Execution

PRESS RELEASE

July 22, 2026

(Town of Lisle, NY) A Town of Lisle man is facing multiple felony drug and weapon charges after a search warrant execution found 84 grams of methamphetamine, other drug paraphernalia and a high-capacity rifle magazine on Tuesday.

On July 21st, 2026, The Broome County Special Investigations Unit Task Force executed a narcotics search warrant at 17 Watts Road in the Town of Lisle. During a search of the residence task force members recovered the following items.

- Approximately 84.4 grams of methamphetamine
- Numerous different prescription pills
- Narcotics packaging material
- Digital scale
- Cutting agent
- A High-capacity Rifle Magazine

Following the investigation, the target of the search warrant, Kyle S. Dixon, age 38 of the Town of Lisle, was charged with the following:

- Criminal possession of a controlled substance in the 2nd Degree, a Class A-II Felony.

- Criminal Possession of a Controlled Substance in the 3rd Degree, a Class B Felony
- Four (4) Counts of Criminal Possession of a Controlled Substance in the 5th Degree, Class D Felonies
- Three (3) Counts of Criminally using Drug Paraphernalia in the 2nd Degree, Class A Misdemeanors
- Criminal Possession of a Weapon in the 3rd Degree, a Class D Felony

The Broome County Special Investigations Unit Task Force is comprised of members of the Broome County Sheriff's Office, the Binghamton Police Department, and the Johnson City Police Department.

The Task Force was assisted on scene by the Broome County Sheriff's Office Strategic Response Group.

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
